RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

AMENDMENT TO RULE 31-1(f) APPROVED

The Commission approved an amendment to Rule 31-1(f) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 to continue to exempt certain transactions in over-the-counter National Market System securities from the imposition of Section 31 transactions fees. (Rel. 34-26790)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC RELEASES STUDY "PROGRAM TRADING AND PRICE MOVEMENTS AROUND THE OCTOBER 1987 MARKET BREAK"

A study by the Office of Economic Analysis at the Commission examines the role of program trading on five days surrounding the October 1987 market break. SEC economist Dean Furbush analyzed program trading and price movements over five minute intervals on October 14 through 20, 1987. Index arbitrage and portfolio insurance, the two dominant trading strategies using program trading on the days studied, were examined separately. (Press Release 89-29)

WILLIAM P. HICKS SELECTED AS ASSISTANT REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR (ENFORCEMENT) - MIAMI BRANCH OFFICE

William P. Hicks has been selected to fill the new position of Assistant Regional Administrator (Enforcement) in the Commission's Miami Branch Office (MBO). Mr. Hicks is a graduate of Brooklyn Law School and was an Assistant State Attorney in Orlando, Florida before joining the Commission staff in 1984. Mr. Hicks has been the Chief of Branch of Enforcement No. 1 in the MBO since 1986.

CHARLES D. HOCHMUTH SELECTED AS SPECIAL ASSISTANT REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR (REGULATION) - MIAMI BRANCH OFFICE

Charles D. Hochmuth has been selected to fill the new position of Special Assistant Regional Administrator (Regulation) in the Commission's Miami Branch Office (MBO). Mr. Hochmuth has been employed by the Commission since 1962. Prior to joining the Commission, Mr. Hochmuth managed an office as a securities broker-dealer. Since 1980 he has been the Chief, Branch of Regulation in the MBO.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NORMAN STEIN BARRED

The Commission instituted an administrative proceeding against Norman Stein, who had been associated with Presidential Capital Corporation, a broker-dealer registered with the Commission. Simultaneously, and pursuant to an Offer of Settlement from Stein, the Commission, based on a Final Injunction against Stein for future violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in *SEC v. Grossman, et al.*, 87 Civ. 1031 (SWK) (SDNY), barred Stein from association with any registered entity with a right to reapply in two years. Stein was not alleged to have used his association with Presidential Capital in furthering the insider trading scheme set forth in the civil injunctive matter. (Rel. 34-26777)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF NOVAFERON LABS, INC.

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of trading in the securities of Novaferon Labs, Inc., a Colorado corporation with executive offices in Akron, Ohio, for the ten-day period beginning at 9:30 a.m. (EDT) on May 9 and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EDT) on May 18.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading because of questions about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning the valuation of the company's assets, the results of its business operations, and the identity of the owners of the company's stocks and warrants.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

QUALITY SERVICES COMPANY AND WALTER JUREK ENJOINED, DISGORGEMENT ORDERED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on April 25 Jurek Enterprises Inc., doing business as Quality Services Company, and Walter Jurek, both of Santa Barbara, California, were permanently enjoined, by consent, from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and from violations or aiding and abetting violations of various provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940 by the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California. In addition, the Court ordered Jurek to pay to The Santa Barbara Fund shares and cash valued in total at approximately \$134,000 and execute a promissory note for an additional \$45,000 plus interest over 18 months.

The Complaint alleged that the registered investment adviser and its principal violated the various antifraud provisions by their offer and sale of shares of the mutual fund and that in managing the fund they violated or caused it to violate Investment Company Act provisions against, among other things, misrepresentations in registration statements, reports and records, deviation from investment restrictions, and sales and redemptions based on an incorrect net asset value. (SEC v. The Santa Barbara Fund, Jurek Enterprises Inc., d/b/a Quality Services Company, and Walter Jurek, USDC CDCA, Civil Action No. 88-02008 JGD (Bx)). (LR-12086)

AMENDED JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST KAZIMIR GOLAC ORDERING DISGORGEMENT

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on April 11 Judge Justin L. Quackenbush entered an Amended Judgment against Kazimir Golac. The Amended Judgment orders Golac to disgorge money in the amount of Cdn.\$1,107,096.78, representing fraudulently obtained profits from the sale of stock of Golden Bear Resources, Ltd., a British Columbia company.

The initial judgment in the case, following trial in September 1987, had found Golac liable for violation of the antifraud and registration provisions of the securities laws and had determined that he should disgorge profits from his sales of Golden Bear stock. The Court had ordered Golac to provide an accounting of his profits. The Court entered the Amended Judgment when Golac failed to provide the accounting. The Amended Judgment found that the value of the stock sold by Golac was created entirely by Golac's fraudulent promotion of the stock, involving false statements, omissions, and market manipulation. Accordingly, the Court ordered Golac to disgorge the entire amount of proceeds which he received from his sales. (SEC v. Golden Bear Resources, Ltd., et al., USDC EDMI, Case No. C86-736-JLQ). MERRILL LYNCH INSTITUTIONAL FUND

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A supplemental Memorandum Opinion and Order has been issued releasing jurisdiction, as set forth in the May 12, 1988 Memorandum Opinion and Order [Rel. 35-24641], and authorizing a proposal by EUA Power Corporation, subsidiary of Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA). EUA Power has been authorized to issue 17-1/2% Series C Secured Notes (Series C Notes) on May 15, 1989 in the amount of \$26,107,102 and on November 15, 1989 in the amount of \$29,145,316, in lieu of the semi-annual cash interest payments due on those dates on EUA Power's outstanding 17-1/2% Series B Secured Notes and Series C Notes. EUA Power further has been authorized to issue and sell, and EUA has been authorized to acquire, through May 14, 1990, up to an additional \$15.6 million of Class A 25% Cumulative Convertible Preferred Stock in order to fund EUA Power's share of costs associated with its joint ownership interest in the Seabrook Nuclear Power Project and to maintain EUA Power's debt/equity ratio. In connection therewith, EUA has been authorized to finance its acquisition of EUA Power's Preferred Stock through the issuance, through December 31, 1989, of up to an additional \$15.6 million of short-term notes to banks under its existing lines of credit. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change has been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The Boston Stock Exchange (SR-BSE-89-2) and The Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-89-1) to clarify their Intermarket Trading System rules regarding pre-opening responses and third participating market center trade-throughs. (Rel. 34-26780; 34-26781)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 8.

PARTIAL APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission extended the near-term options expiration pilot programs of the American, Philadelphia, and Pacific Stock Exchanges and the Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-Amex-88-35; SR-Phlx-88-43; SR-PSE-88-29; SR-CBOE-88-26) for an additional 60 days until June 30, 1989. (Rel. 34-26782)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-89-2) that accelerates the comparison cycle for over-the-counter and non-NYSE exchange trades. (Rel. 34-26783)
