ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO FORM U5S AND RULE 48(b) UNDER THE PUBLIC UTILITY HOLDING COMPANY ACT OF 1935

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The SEC has amended Form U5S to relieve the reporting companies from stating the amount of compensation paid to employees, other than officers, who in the year are paid \$15,000 or more but less than \$40,000, and to substitute a summary of loans and guarantees to or for the account of employees for the itemized list now required. Rule 48(b) has been amended to limit generally the amount of exempted loans or guarantees to not more than \$10,000 for the account of any one employee. This limit may be exceeded with respect to a residence occupied by the employee or his family. The limitations do not preclude application for authorization, by order, of appropriate transactions not included in the exemption. Use of the amended Form U5S is optional for the calendar year 1975 and required for subsequent filings. The amendments to Rule 48(b) are effective June 1, 1976. (Rel. 35-19489)

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST OPPENHEIMER & CO. DISMISSED

The Commission had dismissed proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act against Oppenheimer & Co., a New York broker-dealer and investment advisor.

An administrative law judge had found that the Oppenheimer firm violated antifraud provisions through misuse of material non-public "market information" - a forthcoming news story on two issuers of securities. The Commission stated: "There is today no question that the misuse of undisclosed, material 'market information' can be the basis of antifraud violations. Under the circumstances presented here, however, we do not conclude that an adverse finding with respect to this particular respondent is warranted." (Rel. 34-12319)

NASD ACTION AGAINST JOHN H. DEGOLYER AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed the NASD's bar of John H. DeGolyer, of Pittsford, New York, from association with any NASD member in a principal capacity. DeGolyer was president of John J. DeGolyer Company, Inc., a Rochester, New York broker-dealer firm.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that DeGolyer was responsible for his firm's failure to comply with net capital requirements, and for the firm's improper hypothecation of customers' securities. (Rel. 34-12326)

BERNARD G. GREER SUSPENDED

The Commission has instituted administrative proceedings and accepted an offer of settlement of Bernard G. Greer, doing business as Greer & Company, Seattle, Washington, in which Greer, without admitting or denying the allegations of the order, consented to findings that he wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. On the basis of the offer of settlement, Greer was suspended from association with any broker or dealer, investment adviser or investment company for a period of two months, followed by suspension for a period of ten months from such association except as a non-supervisory employee under supervision deemed adequate by the Commission's Seattle Regional Office. TRADING SUSPENSIONS

SUSPENSION OF GEICO TERMINATED

The SEC announced the termination of the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Government Employees Insurance Company (GEICO), a casualty insurance company located in Chevy Chase, Maryland, at midnight (EST) on April 16, 1976.

The Commission initially ordered the suspension in view of the possible lack of adequate and accurate public information regarding the company's operations, financial condition and provision for loss reserves. Later trading suspensions were ordered to permit time for the dissemination of information relating to GEICO's financial condition and certain management changes. The Commission advised that the company is continuing to explore various avenues for raising capital. (Rel. 34-12349)

Heublein is engaged in the production and the distribution of alcoholic beverages including distilled spirits and wines and the processing and sale of Kentucky Fried Chicken through retail convenience food outlets and of other food products. (S-1) TELEPHONE AND DATA SYSTEMS, INC.

79 West Monroe St., Chicago, Ill. 60603 - \$2 million of Series B subordinated debentures, to be offered for sale in denominations of \$100, \$500, \$1,000 and \$5,000. Telephone and Data Systems acquires and operates, as a holding company, controlling interests in telephone companies and related companies in the communications industry. (File 2-55861 - Mar. 30)

The company is a closed-end, diversified, management investment company, investing primarily for the longer term. PepsiCo, Inc. will merge a wholly-owned subsidiary, established solely for the purposes of this transaction, into Lee Way Motor Freight, Inc. and, upon consummation of the merger, Lee Way Motor Freight, Inc. will become a wholly-owned subsidiary of PepsiCo, Inc. Upon consummation of the merger, the Lee Way Motor Freight, Inc. stockholders will receive shares of PepsiCo, Inc. capital stock in exchange for their Lee Way Motor Freight, Inc. common stock at an exchange ratio determined by dividing \$20.00 by the average closing price of PepsiCo, Inc. capital stock for the 10 business days immediately preceding the date on which the merger becomes effective.
