U.S. SECURITIES AND

EXCHANGE COMMISSION

PROPOSED RULES REGARDING GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PAPERS AND APPLICATIONS UNDER THE INVESTMENT ADVISERS ACT OF 1940

The Commission announced that it is requesting public comments on a proposal to (1) adopt Rules 0-4, 0-5, and 0-6 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 regarding the general requirements for papers and applications and the procedure with respect to applications and other matters, including a provision for incorporation by reference; and (2) amend the title of Rule 204-1 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 to clarify the fact that it refers only to applications for registration. All comments on these proposed rules should be addressed to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C. 20549. Comments should be received on or before July 15, 1976 and should refer to File No. S7-632. (Rel. IA-516)

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF CORPORATION FINANCE

> The Commission has announced the amendment of Section 200.30-1 of the Commission's Statement of Organization; Conduct and Ethics; and Information and Requests by adding a new paragraph, (b) (8), to Chapter II of Title 17 of the Code of Federal Regulations. The amendment delegates to the Director of the Division of Corporation Finance authority to grant applications for release of reports filed with the Commission on Form 1-G pursuant to Rule 316(a) under Regulation B of the Securities Act of 1933. DISCLOSURE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SOLICITS PUBLIC STATEMENTS ON 12 BROAD ISSUES

> The Advisory Committee on Corporate Disclosure has invited all interested persons to submit their views on a number of issues which it intends to address in the course of its study.

This first direct solicitation of public views is undertaken to emphasize the Committee's desire to be apprised of the viewpoints of all persons and entities associated with and affected by the corporate disclosure system, including members of the general public, individual investors, publicly owned companies, interested professionals, members of the investment community, members of the financial media and associations. By direct letter, the Committee has also invited 100 public interest groups and trade associations to submit their views and to establish liason with the staff of the Committee.

Because of time constraints affecting the Committee's work schedule, it is requested that the position statements be submitted not later than September 30, 1976. TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN ENERGY RESERVE INC.

The SEC has announced the single ten-day suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Energy Reserve Inc., an Arizona corporation located in

Phoenix, for the period beginning on May 19 and terminating at midnight (EDT) on May 28, 1976. The Commission initiated the suspension because of a lack of adequate and accurate information regarding the company's operations and financial condition. (Rel. 34-12459)

The SEC has announced the suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Equity Funding Corp. and Orion Capital Corp. for the further ten-day period May 21 - 30, inclusive.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

ROBERT J. PAUL ENJOINED

The Denver Regional Office announced that the Honorable Fred M. Winner, U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Colorado on May 3 signed an order permanently enjoining Robert J. Paul from violation of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of the common stock of Polaris Mining Company, fractional undivided interests in various Polaris Mining properties and any other security of any issuer. Paul consented to the permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint. (SEC v. Polaris Mining Company, et al., D. Colo., Civil Action No. 75-W-695). (LR-7395)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MASSACHUSETTS MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rule 17d-1 thereunder to permit Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company, the investment adviser for MassMutual Corporate Investors, Inc., a non-diversified, closed-end management investment company registered under the Act, to purchase a new issue of debt securities of Victoria Station Incorporated. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

DELMARVA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 11 to request a hearing on a proposal of Delmarva Power & Light Company, a registered holding company, whereby Delmarva proposes to issue and sell unsecured short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to a dealer in commercial paper from time to time through December 31, 1977 in a maximum aggregate principal amount of \$75 million at any one time outstanding.
