ADOPTION OF ITEM 404 OF REGULATION S-K

The Commission announced the adoption of a new Regulation S-K item, Item 404, Certain relationships and related transactions, which provides for uniform disclosure of transactions and relationships involving management, and the adoption of certain conforming rule, form and schedule amendments. These actions are being taken as part of the Commission's Proxy Review Program, which includes a comprehensive reexamination of the disclosure requirements and procedural provisions relating to the solicitation of proxies. Item 404 and the conforming amendments are effective for all documents filed on or after July 1, 1983, but may be complied with earlier at the election of the registrant. (Rel. 33-6441)

COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN ISSUERS AND BENEFICIAL OWNERS OF NOMINEE HELD SECURITIES

The Commission has issued a release publishing for comment certain rule amendments relating to recommendations made by the Advisory Committee on Shareholder Communications. The amendments being considered are intended to (1) tighten the timetable for proxy distribution contained in Rules 14b-1 and 14a-3(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, (2) eliminate, under certain limited circumstances, the obligation of an issuer to disseminate the material that must be delivered to beneficial owners pursuant to current Rule 14a-3(b), and (3) establish, without altering the current process for proxy distribution, a means by which issuers could obtain the identities, addresses and security positions of consenting beneficial owners. All comments should be sent in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, DC 20549 on or before March 11, 1983 and should refer to File No. S7-954. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

PIERRE PETROU ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on December 2 a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction was entered by the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia enjoining Pierre J. Petrou from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Petrou consented to the entry of the Judgment against him without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint, which was also filed on December 2.

The complaint alleged that Petrou violated Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder by purchasing the common stock of International Proteins Corp. (IPC) prior to IPC's announcement of an "agreement in principle" to sell 1,000,000 shares of newly issued common stock at a premium over the traded market price of IPC stock. Petrou has been ordered to disgorge his profits from these purchases. (SEC v. Pierre J. Petrou, Civil Action No. 82-3413, D.D.C.). (LR-9828)

**COMPLAINT NAMES SATELLITE TELEVISION
AND ASSOCIATED RESOURCES, INC.**

The Commission announced that on November 29 it filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Satellite Television and Associated Resources, Inc. (STAR) of Santa Monica, California. The Commission in its complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief.

The Commission alleges, in its complaint, that STAR, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file various periodic reports in a timely fashion and failed, to the date of the complaint, to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 31, 1981, required to have been filed by March 31, 1982, and its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended June 30 and September 30, 1982, due to be filed by August 14 and November 15, 1982, respectively. The Commission requests that the Court order STAR to file its delinquent annual and quarterly reports with the Commission forthwith and that the Court enjoin STAR from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GIT TAX-FREE TRUST

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting GIT Tax-Free Trust, registered under the Act as an open-end, diversified, management investment company, from the provisions of (1) Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit Applicant (a) to compute the net asset value per share of its "Money Market Portfolio" to the nearest cent on a share value of \$1.00; (b) to consider the maturity of variable rate demand notes in its portfolio as the longer of the notice period required before Applicant would be entitled to prepayment on the note or the period remaining until the note's next interest rate adjustment; and (c) to value in the manner described in the application rights acquired from issuers, dealers or banks to sell portfolio securities to such persons; and (2) Section 12(d)(3) of the Act, to permit Applicant to acquire rights to sell its portfolio securities to brokers or dealers. THE MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY OF NEW YORK
