ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

DECISION RE J. BAKER TUTTLE CORPORATION AND TUTTLE & COMPANY

The decision of an administrative law judge revoking the investment adviser registrations of J. Baker Tuttle Corp. and Tuttle & Co., of Palm Beach, Florida and barring Jason Baker Tuttle, Sr. from association with any investment adviser has become final. The law judge found that respondents violated antifraud, reporting and recordkeeping provisions of the Investment Advisers Act. Among other things, the law judge found that Tuttle Corp. and Tuttle & Co. accepted fees from clients while failing to disclose that they were insolvent, and that Tuttle Corp. failed to provide pro rata refunds of advance fees paid by clients who cancelled their investment advisory service agreements. The law judge found that Tuttle Sr. willfully aided and abetted these violations. (Rel. IA-1271)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company, electric public-utility subsidiary companies of General Public Utilities Corporation, a registered holding company, to amend their lease for the Pennsylvania-New Jersey-Maryland Interconnection Office to include joint and several liability up to an aggregate amount of \$20 million. LOUISIANA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 11, to request a hearing on a proposal by Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), an electric publicutility subsidiary company of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company, to issue and sell, through December 31, 1992, each in one or more new series: (1) up to \$200 million aggregate principal amount of its first mortgage bonds (Bonds); and (2) up to \$200 million aggregate par value of its preferred stock, cumulative, either \$25 par value or \$100 par value (Preferred). In addition, LP&L proposes to enter into the sale and repurchase of certain pollution control facilities located at Unit 3 of its Waterford Steam Electric Generating Station and guarantees related thereto in connection with a transaction financed by up to \$200 million of tax-exempt bonds to be issued and sold by the Parish of St. Charles, Louisiana. Security and payment on such tax-exempt bonds may be arranged under an irrevocable letter of credit and/or pursuant to an issuance of collateral bonds in one or more new series, either or both in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$244 million. LP&L also proposes to use the proceeds of the sale of Bonds and Preferred to repurchase, through December 31, 1992, one or more series of its first mortgage bonds, preferred stock and certain revenue bonds issued for the benefit of LP&L. ENERGY INITIATIVES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 11, to request a hearing on a proposal by Energy Initiatives, Inc. (EII), a subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, a registered holding company. EII proposes to acquire, directly or indirectly through a wholly-owned subsidiary to be formed (EII-Sub), the interests of two Delaware limited partnerships and their affiliates in a 79.9 megawatt (MW) Qualifying Cogeneration Facility, as defined in the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978, and regulations thereunder, being developed in the Village of Selkirk, Bethlehem, New York; in 270 MW of additional generating capacity being developed at that project site; and in related transactions. ENTERGY CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 11, to request a hearing on a proposal by Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company, to adopt, subject to stockholder approval at the 1991 Annual Meeting of Stockholders, an Equity Ownership Plan for Entergy Corporation and Subsidiaries (Executive Plan) and a Stock Plan for Outside Directors (Director Plan). Entergy Corporation also proposes to grant from time to time through December 31, 2001, Options, Restricted Shares and Equity Awards under the Executive Plan and, in connection therewith, to issue or sell the shares of Common Stock acquired by the Independent Agent under the two plans in amounts of up to 3 million shares under the Executive Plan and up to 500,000 shares of Common Stock under the Director Plan. Entergy has been authorized to solicit proxies from its shareholders in connection with obtaining approval for the plans at its May 17, 1991 Annual Meeting. (Rel. 35-25259)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>Chicago Board</u> <u>Options Exchange</u> (SR-CBOE-90-32) that permits the listing of options that expire up to 39 months from the date of issuance for all products other than index options. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of February 18. (Rel. 34-28890)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has granted accelerated approval of a proposed rule change by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-AMEX-90-37) under Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act. The proposed rule change amends the AMEX's Post Execution Reporting (PER) system and its Options Switching (AMOS) system eligibility requirements to increase the size of market and limit orders that may be routed through those systems. Specifically, the proposed rule change increases the size eligibility of PER market orders from 2,000 to 3,000 shares (and increases the size eligibility to 5,000 shares after six months, at the discretion of the exchange), and increases AMOS market and limit orders from 20 to 30 option contracts. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of January 18. (Rel. 34-28891)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES	

PUBLIC SERVICE ELECTRIC AND GAS COMPANY

The Commission has issued a notice giving interested persons until March 11, to request a hearing on an application by Public Service Electric and Gas Company (Company), a New Jersey corporation, pursuant to Section 304(c)(1) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939. Section 316(a)(1) of the Trust Indenture Act (Act) would require certain increases in the percentages of bondholders required to act pursuant to the First and Refunding Mortgage Bonds (Bonds) under an indenture dated as of August 1, 1924, as amended by the Supplemental Indenture dated as of March 1, 1942, between the Company and Fidelity Union Trust Company (now First Fidelity Bank, National Association, New Jersey) as Trustee as supplemented by a Supplemental Indenture dated as of July 1, 1989, and Supplemental Indentures Nos. 1 and 2 dated as of July 1, 1990. The application by the Company is for an order exempting the Bonds from certain provisions of Section 316(a)(1) of the Act to the extent such increases would be required. (Rel. TI-2257)
