RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

NET CAPITAL RULE AMENDED

The Commission announced that it is publishing amendments to its net capital rule. Rule 15c3-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 will be amended to require broker-dealers to notify the Commission when it makes large distributions of net capital to affiliated parties; to give the Commission the authority to prohibit withdrawals of net capital from a broker-dealer under certain circumstances; and to prohibit withdrawals of net capital at an earlier stage than is now permitted. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES NICODEMUS FAITOS AND FAITOS & COMPANY INCORPORATED

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 27, the Commission filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York against Nicodemus E. Faitos (Faitos) of Comack, N.Y., and Faitos & Co., Inc. (Faitos & Co.) of Huntington, N.Y. The complaint seeks permanent injunctions and disgorgement against both defendants, plus an asset freeze and an accounting against Faitos, for violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5. The complaint alleges that from at least June 1, 1987 to the present, Faitos and Faitos & Co. misappropriated approximately \$1,800,000 from investors through diversions of investors' money and unauthorized redemptions of mutual fund securities.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Faitos and Faitos & Co. consented to the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief granting the relief sought in the Commission's complaint. [SEC v. Nicodemus E. Faitos and Faitos & Co., Inc., Civil Action No. 91-0690, E.D.N.Y., February 27, 1991] (LR-12786)

COMPLAINT NAMES ROBERT WHITE

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 1, the Commission filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey against Robert A. White (White) of Jersey City, New Jersey. The complaint seeks preliminary and permanent injunctions, an asset freeze, an accounting, and disgorgement in an action arising from White's alleged violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 (the anti-fraud provisions). The complaint alleges that from at least July 1, 1985 to the present, White misappropriated approximately \$868,097 from investors who had given White money to invest in securities, mainly government securities.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, White, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, consented to the entry of a preliminary injunction, an asset freeze, and an accounting. On February 1, the Honorable Nicholas H. Politan, U.S. District Judge, issued an Order of Preliminary Injunction and for an Asset Freeze and other Equitable Relief. The litigation is pending. [SEC v. Robert A. White, Civil Action No. 91-451, D.N.J., February 1, 1991] (LR-12787)

COURT RULES AGAINST CHARLES STEADMAN, STEADMAN SECURITY CORP. AND THE STEADMAN FUNDS

The Philadelphia Regional Office announced that on February 27, Judge Oberdorfer of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia granted judgment for the Commission in its case against the Steadman Funds (Funds), a mutual fund group; Steadman Security Corporation (SSC), registered investment adviser and transfer agent for the Funds; and Charles W. Steadman, president and chairman of the board of SSC and the Funds. The Commission's action was filed on July 17, 1989 and tried on November 7 and 8, 1990. The Court found for the Commission on all of its claims and stated that the evidence "entitles the SEC to injunctive relief..."

The Court found antifraud, share pricing, and reporting violations arising out of defendants' failure to register Fund shares under state laws from 1971 to 1988, while offering and selling shares in all of the states. As a result of failing to register, the Funds accrued material liabilities for unpaid fees, penalties, and possible shareholder suits, which were neither booked nor disclosed to investors. Further, the Court found that the net asset value of Fund shares was improperly calculated. In addition, the Court found violations of certain investment adviser custody and transfer agent rules. (SEC v. Charles W. Steadman, et al., Civil Action No. 89-2026-LFO, D.D.C) (LR-12788)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TEMPLETON AMERICAN GROWTH TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 25 to request a hearing on an application filed by Templeton American Growth Trust, Inc. and Templeton Funds Distributor, Inc. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting them from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder to permit the imposition and waiver of a contingent deferred sales charge. (Rel. IC-18018 - February 26)

NIPSCO CAPITAL MARKETS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by NIPSCO Capital Markets, Inc. seeking an Order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act for an exemption from all provisions of the Act. (Rel. IC-18019 - February 26)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

TEMPORARY APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has temporarily extended a proposed rule change filed pursuant to Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act by The <u>Depository Trust Company</u> (SR-DTC-90-13) that would allow DTC to continue to operate as a pilot program a Rush Withdrawal Transfer (RWT) service. Publication of the proposed rule is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of February 25. (Rel. 34-28912)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has granted accelerated approval to proposed rule changes filed under Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act by the <u>Pacific Stock Exchange</u> (SR-PSE-91-07) and the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-AMEX-91-02) to list long-term equity options that expire up to 39 months from the date of issuance. Publication of the proposals is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 4. (Rel. 34-28914)
