COMMISSION AND NASAA ANNOUNCE 1991 CONFERENCE ON FEDERAL-STATE SECURITIES REGULATION

The Commission and the North American Securities Administrators Association, Inc. (NASAA) announced that the annual conference on Federal-State Securities Regulation will be held on April 19, 1991. Because participation at the conference is generally limited to Commission and NASAA personnel, the release indicates that interested persons should participate by providing written comments by April 12.

REQUEST FOR COMMENT ON ACCOUNTING FOR RETURN OF A NONACCRUAL LOAN TO ACCRUAL STATUS AFTER A PARTIAL CHARGE-OFF

The Commission issued a request for public comment on whether an accounting method being proposed by the Federal Financial Institutions Examination Council (FFIEC) would be acceptable in financial statements filed with the Commission by bank or thrift holding companies. The FFIEC is proposing, for purposes of reporting to federal banking and thrift regulators, to establish criteria under which a depository institution may return a nonaccrual loan to accrual status, even though full recovery of the loan's contractual principal amount may not be expected. Comment letters should be received on or before 45 days after publication in the Federal Register. Such letters should be submitted in triplicate to Jonathan G. Katz, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20549, and should refer to File No. S7-5-91 (Rel. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST BRIAN ALLEN AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on Brian G. Allen, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Allen was formerly associated with Eneric Financial Services, Inc., an NASD member firm. The NASD censured Allen, fined him \$5,000 and barred him from association with any member.

The commission found, as had the NASD, that Allen forged a check payable to himself from an affiliate of his employer and converted the proceeds. In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission noted that "there can hardly be more serious misconduct in the securities business than forgery and theft." (Rel. 34-28925)

UNIFIED MUTUAL SHARES

An order has been issued on an application filed by Unified Mutual Shares, Inc. under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Unified Mutual Shares, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-18037 - March 13)

CAPITOL STREET CORPORATION

A conditional order has been issued under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act on an application filed by Capitol Street Corporation and Galaxie Corporation exempting Capitol from all provisions of the Act other than Sections 9, 17(a), 17(d) (except to the extent necessary to reduce the number of Capitol shareholders to 100 or fewer), 17(e), 36, and 37 and Rule 17f-2 thereunder until June 30, 1991. TEMPLETON FUNDS ANNUITY COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 8 to request a hearing on an application filed by Templeton Funds Annuity Company and Templeton Funds Retirement Annuity Separate Account (Separate Account), for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from the assets of the Separate Account. NORTHEAST UTILITIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 8 to request a hearing on a proposal by Northeast Utilities (NU), a registered holding company, and its service company subsidiary, Northeast Utilities Service Company (NUSCO), for NU to issue and sell its common stock, \$5.00 par value, (Common Shares) pursuant to its Executive Incentive Plan (Plan), through December 31, 2000, in aggregate annual amounts rot exceeding an amount equal to 1/4 of one percent of the outstanding shares of common stock as of December 31 of the previous year. NU also proposes to reacquire forfeited Common Shares under the Plan and to have NUSCO acquire NU Common Shares in the open market to pay awards under the Plan. NU may also reissue treasury shares for such awards. NU was authorized to solicit proxies from its shareholders for use at NU's Annual Meeting of Shareholders with respect to approval of the Plan and the issuance of up to 11 million authorized but unissued shares of common stock to an Employee Stock Ownership Plan, subject to further Commission approval. AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u> filed an amendment to a proposed rule change with the <u>Commission</u> under Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act to require a member that clears market maker trades to provide the CBOE written notice of a significant business transaction and, in some instances, obtain prior approval by the CBOE for the proposed transaction. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

PUBLIC SERVICE ELECTRIC AND GAS COMPANY
