COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHAIRMAN AND COMMISSIONERS TO TESTIFY

Commissioner Schapiro will testify before the Subcommittee on Intellectual Property and Judicial Administration of the House Judiciary Committee on Thursday, April 25, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The subject of the hearing is H.R. 1717, a proposal to amend the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act. The hearing will be in Room 2237 of the Rayburn House Office Building.

Chairman Breeden will testify before the Financial Institutions Subcommittee of the Banking Committee of the House of Representatives on Tuesday, April 30, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The subject of the hearing is the Treasury's comprehensive bank restructuring proposal and related bills introduced by Chairman Gonzalez (H.R. 6) and Congressman Wylie (H.R. 15). The hearing will be in Room 2128 of the Rayburn House Office Building.

Commissioner Lochner will testify before the Subcommittee on Energy and Power of the House Energy and Commerce Committee on Wednesday, May 1, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The subject is proposed amendments to the Public Utility Holding Company Act, H.R. 1301 and H.R. 1543. Room will be announced.

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EQUUS CAPITAL PARTNERS

An order has been issued under Sections 6(c) and 57(i) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1 thereunder in response to an application by Equus Capital Partners, L.P., Equus Investments I, L.P., Equus Investments II, L.P., Equus Investments Incorporated, Equus Capital Corporation and Equus Capital Management Corporation. The order permits Applicants to conduct certain joint transactions which are otherwise prohibited under Section 57(a)(4). (Rel. IC-18105 - April 18)

SECURITY FIRST LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Security First Life Insurance Company, Security First Life Separate Account A (SFL Account) and Security First Financial, Inc. from the provisions of Sections 26(a) and 27(c)(2) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges and a distribution expense charge from the assets of the SFL Account under certain group variable annuity contracts. GLOBAL INCOME PLUS FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 20 to request a hearing on an application filed by the Global Income Plus Fund, Inc., et al. for a conditional order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act. The conditional order would exempt applicants from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act and Rule 12d3-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit them to invest in equity or convertible debt securities issued by foreign issuers that derived more than 15% of their gross revenues from their activities as a broker, dealer, underwriter, or investment adviser, provided such investments meet the conditions described in proposed amended Rule 12d3-1. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COLUMBUS SOUTHERN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 13 to request a hearing on a proposal by Columbus Southern Power Company (CSP) and American Electric Power Service Company (AEPSC), subsidiaries of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company. AEPSC proposes to render certain services to the owners of the Zimmer Generating Station (Owners), including CSP. CSP, along with the other Owners, proposes to indemnify AEPSC and its associated companies against all costs, liabilities and damages arising out of AEPSC's performance of its duties under the service agreement. AEPSC also requests an exemption from the "at cost" standard of Section 13(b) of Act with regard to the sale of replacement parts to the Owners. (Rel. 35-25299)

EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM
