ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING ORDERED AGAINST GREGORY HERBERT

The Commission has ordered public administrative proceedings pursuant to Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) against Gregory Herbert (Herbert), formerly associated with Parr Securities Corp., a broker-dealer registered with the Commission until April 11, 1986.

The Order Instituting Proceedings alleges that between 1983 and May 1985 Herbert wilfully violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder by, <u>inter alia</u>, converting customers' securities to his own use and engaging in fraudulent repurchase agreements.

On May 7, 1985, pursuant to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction by Consent, Herbert was permanently enjoined from future violations of the antifraud provisions [SEC v. Parr Securities Corp., 85 Civ. 3451, EW, SDNY]. Herbert was also convicted of mail, wire and securities fraud and sentenced to three years in prison [U.S. v. Gregory Herbert, 85 Cr. 1099, LBS, SDNY]. A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Herbert are true and, if so, to decide what remedial action, if any, is appropriate. (Rel. 34-29678)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

LOUIS SOQUI ADDED AS DEFENDANT

The Commission announced that on September 10 the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California granted the Commission's motion for leave to file an amended complaint in SEC v. David D. Sterns, et al. The amended complaint adds an additional defendant, Louis Soqui, to the Commission's civil action filed on March 11, 1991 against David Sterns and twenty-three other defendants.

The Commission's amended complaint alleges that Soqui was the executive vice president of The Huntor Group and was the president and chief executive officer of National Breast Centers, a subsidiary of Huntor. The Commission alleges that Soqui misrepresented and failed to disclose numerous material facts to induce investors to buy the unregistered securities of Huntor and National Breast Centers.

The Commission seeks to permanently enjoin Soqui from further violations of Sections 5 and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission also seeks the entry of an order requiring Soqui to pay disgorgement of monies he received through the unlawful sale of securities. [SEC v. David D. Sterns, et al., Civil Action No. 91-1303-ER, Tx] (LR-12946)

EDWIN TUNICK PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on September 3 the Honorable William J. Zloch, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of Florida, entered a Final Judgement of Permanent Injunction (Final Judgment) against defendant Edwin Tunick (Tunick) of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The Final Judgment permanently enjoins him from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Tunick consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint.

The complaint, filed on June 14, 1990, alleges, among other things, that Tunick violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5. Tunick is alleged to have committed the violations by disseminating materially false and misleading information to broker-dealers either making a market or contemplating making a market in American British Enterprises, Inc.'s common stock in connection with a non-exempt unregistered distribution. [SEC v. Herman J. Schannault, et al., Civil Action No. 90-6483-CIV-ZLOCH] (LR-12979)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE EMERGING GERMANY FUND INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 15 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Emerging Germany Fund Inc. (Fund), Asset Management Advisors of Dresdner Bank - Gesellschaft fuer Vermoegensanlageberatung mbH (AMA) and ABD Securities Corporation. The application is for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting AMA and ABD Securities Corporation from Section 15(a) of the Act. AMA and ABD Securities Corporation would be exempted to the extent necessary to permit them to continue to provide investment advisory services to the Fund until the earlier of January 31, 1992 or the date on which the Fund's stockholders approve the Fund's advisory contracts with AMA and ABD Securities Corporation. (Rel. IC-18323; International Series Rel. 316 - September 18)

LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

UNLISTED TRADING PRIVILEGES GRANTED

Orders have been issued granting the applications of four exchanges for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock of issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. The exchanges and number of issues are as follows:

Philadelphia Stock Exchange - 1 issue; Pacific Stock Exchange - 6 issues; Midwest Stock Exchange - 3 issues; and Cincinnati Stock Exchange - 21 issues. (Rels. 34-29690; 34-29691; 34-29693 and 34-29694, respectively)

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 8 to comment on the application of Orbit Gas Company to withdraw its Common Stock, No Par Value, from listing and registration on the <u>Boston Stock Exchange</u>. (Rel. 34-29700)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-91-45) under Rule 19b-4. The proposed rule change amends Schedule C to the NASD's By-Laws to adopt deadlines for the consideration of applications for membership and to extend the effectiveness of membership restrictions to successors to the ownership or control of the applicant. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of September 23. (Rel. 34-29701)

The <u>American Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-91-21) under Rule 19b-4 to increase from 20 to 50 contracts the size of the orders for Major Market Index options that are eligible for execution through the Exchange's automated execution system. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of September 23. (Rel. 34-29703)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> (SR-PHLX-91-13) that expands the Exchange's prohibition against a floor broker exercising discretion over a Registered Options Trader's (ROT) order to include any price discretion. Currently, floor brokers are prohibited from exercising any discretion as to the class, quantity or nature (i.e., buy or sell) of an ROT's order. Publication of the approval order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of September 23. (Rel. 34-29702)
