COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

JOINT STATEMENT ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF IMPROVED COOPERATION

The SEC and the Commission of the European Communities (EC) will sign a Joint Statement on the Establishment of Improved Cooperation. The signing will take place at 3:00 p.m. today in the Cannon Room of the J.W. Marriott Hotel. The Joint Statement will be signed by Richard C. Breeden, Chairman of the SEC, and Sir Leon Brittan, Vice President of the EC. The signatories will be available for a press conference after the signing. (Press Rel. 91-50)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST THOMAS REYNOLDS SECURITIES, LTD. AND MILTON NETCHER AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed disciplinary action taken by the NASD against Thomas P. Reynolds Securities, Ltd., a New York City brokerage firm, and Milton A. Netcher, the

firm's chief executive officer. The NASD censured the firm and Netcher and fined them \$15,000, jointly and severally, for violating recordkeeping, reporting and fidelity bonding requirements.

The misconduct found by the Commission and the NASD occurred between August 1986 and November 1988. Throughout that period the firm lacked a fidelity bond. Netcher falsely represented to the NASD that the firm had applied for coverage. However, a bond was not obtained until the NASD threatened the firm with suspension. In addition, the auditor of the firm's 1987 annual report was not independent because he had been retained to prepare the same financial statements that he ultimately audited. Before filing that report, Netcher had told the NASD that a different auditor would be used. Finally, the firm's January 1988 net capital computation and other records were substantially inaccurate.

In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission emphasized "the manner in which applicants lied to and flouted regulatory authority." (Rel. 34-29689)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST ROBERT AINBINDER AND OTHERS

The New York Regional Office announced that on September 20 it filed a civil complaint for injunctive relief in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York. The complaint was filed against Dierdre C. Steinhaus (Steinhaus), the former President of Revcon (USA) Limited (Revcon), a now inactive broker-dealer, Stephen D. Gellas (Gellas), Revcon's former Financial and Operations Officer, and Robert E. Ainbinder (Ainbinder), a Revcon principal.

The complaint alleges that Steinhaus and Ainbinder violated certain antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws by using a nominee account to purchase securities from certain Ainbinder accounts, which were held by a clearing broker and contained debit balances of over \$330,000. Ainbinder violated the antifraud and credit extension provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by "free-riding" in several accounts held by Revcon's clearing firm.

Finally, the complaint alleges that Steinhaus and Gellas aided and abetted Revcon's violations of the net capital, bookkeeping and financial reporting requirements of the Exchange Act and that Steinhaus aided and abetted Revcon's violations of the broker-dealer registration reporting provisions of the Exchange Act. CEZAR INDUSTRIES, LTD. CONSENTS TO INJUNCTION

The Commission announced that on September 20 it filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia seeking a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction (Final Judgment), against Cezar Industries, Ltd. (Cezar) of 4251 South

Higuera Street, San Luis Obispo, California 94303-4209. The Commission in its complaint seeks to enjoin Cezar from violating Section 13(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 12b-25, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder.

Simultaneously with the filing of the Commission's Complaint, Cezar consented to the entry of a Final Judgment. In its Consent, Cezar admitted that it had filed late one Annual Report on Form 10-K and six Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q and failed to file one Notification of Late Filing on Form 12b-25. According to its most recent Annual Report, Cezar is engaged in providing telephone and other telecommunication services to corporate and individual subscribers. [SEC v. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Pursuant to Rule 19b-4 the Commission has approved proposed rule changes filed by the American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-91-06) and Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-91-11). The Commission has also noticed and approved on an accelerated basis proposed rule changes filed by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-91-18), Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-PHLX-91-28) and Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-91-13). The proposed rule changes establish uniform procedures for selecting, listing, challenging and arbitrating the eligibility of new standardized options overlying both exchange-listed and over-the-counter traded securities. Publication of the approval order is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 23. (Rel. 34-29698)
