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RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

U.S. SECURITIES EXCHANGE COMMISSION

RESCISSION OF TEMPORARY RULES PROVIDING EXEMPTIONS TO CERTAIN MONEY MARKET FUNDS AND OTHER PERSONS AND COMPANIES

The Commission issued a release under the Investment Company Act on October 25 rescinding Rules 6c-4(T) and 6c-5(T). The rules were adopted on a temporary basis to accommodate the issuance and termination of credit control regulations by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System. The Commission proposed for comment the rescission of the rules in Investment Company Act Release No. 18158 dated May 20, 1991. (Rel. IC-18379: S7-13-91)

## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST RUSHTON LEIGH ARDREY, JR.

The Commission on October 18 issued an Order Instituting Public Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) against Rushton Leigh Ardrey, Jr. (Ardrey). The Order is based on the entry of a permanent injunction enjoining Ardrey from violating Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act), and Rules 10b-5 and 14e-3 thereunder to which he consented [SEC v. Rushton Leigh Ardrey, Jr., 91 Civ 6819, CBM]. The Commission accepted Ardrey's Offer of Settlement.

The Commission alleges that Ardrey purchased LPL Technologies, Inc. (LPL) stock while in possession of material, nonpublic information concerning a proposed \$24 per share tender offer by LPL's management. The Commission further alleges that at the time of his purchases of LPL stock, Ardrey was associated with a broker-dealer.

Under the terms of the Offer of Settlement, Ardrey, without admitting or denying the findings contained in the Order, consented to the entry of the Order pursuant to Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Exchange Act barring him from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer, with a right to reapply after five years. CARDINAL FINANCIAL EQUITIES, INC., CARDINAL FINANCIAL PLANNING, INC. AND LEO LOEVNER SANCTIONED

The Commission has issued an Order Instituting Public Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act and the Investment Advisers Act against Cardinal Financial Equities, Inc. (CFE), a registered broker-dealer; Cardinal Financial Planning, Inc. (DFP), a registered investment adviser; and Leo C. Loevner (Loevner). Loevner is the President of CFE and the Vice-President of CFP. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted the Offer of Settlement (Offer) submitted by each Respondent, whereby each consented to the Order, without admitting or denying the findings therein.

On the basis of the Order and the respective Offers, the Commission found that CFE and Loevner engaged in fraudulent offerings and sales of over \$2.7 million in unregistered limited partnership interests. Findings relating to CFP concerned numerous books and records deficiencies, and its misrepresentation of \$625,000 in loans of client funds to an unformed partnership. On September 27, the Commission filed an injunctive action against the Respondents based upon similar allegations (See LR-13029).

Based upon the above findings and respective Offers, CFE's and CFP's registration with the Commission was revoked, and Loevner was barred from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment company or investment adviser. (Rel. 34-29838)

#### CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

PERMANENT INJUNCTION AGAINST MONEY SYSTEMS, INC., LYNN DICKINSON AND ASSOCIATES, AND LYNN DICKINSON

The Commission on October 24 announced that on October 15 the Honorable Judge Vaughn R. Walker, U.S. District Judge for the Northern District of California, entered an Order Adjudging Defendant Lynn F. Dickinson in Civil Contempt for her failure to comply with certain portions of the Court's August 23, 1991, Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Dickinson. The Final Judgment permanently enjoined Dickinson from violating the antifraud and investment adviser registration provisions of the federal securities laws and ordered a freeze of assets, the appointment of a receiver, an accounting, and that Dickinson produce certain documents to the receiver.

In its Contempt Order, the Court found that Dickinson had failed to grant the receiver access to her business records. In addition to finding Dickinson in Civil Contempt, the Court ordered the United States Marshals Service to seize physically all books and records of Dickinson and her two wholly-owned companies, Money Systems, Inc. and Lynn Dickinson and Associates. The Court also ordered the United States Postal Service to deliver directly to the receiver the mail of Dickinson and her companies and that Dickinson submit to an examination under oath by the receiver. [SEC. v. Money Systems, Inc., Lynn Dickinson and Associates, and Lynn F. Dickinson, Civil Action No. C-91-2735, VRW, N.D. Cal.] (LR-13602)

## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

#### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has issued an Order approving a proposed rule change filed by the <u>International Securities Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-ISCC-91-01) that would permit qualified ISCC members utilizing standardized input and output format to obtain access to foreign clearing, settlement and custody services offered by a bank selected by ISCC. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of October 21. (Rel. 34-29841)

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> (SR-NYSE-91-21) that approves on a permanent basis NYSE Rule 80A, a rule that imposes conditions on the execution of index arbitrage and market basket trading on the NYSE after a 50 point upward or downward move in the Dow Jones Industrial Average. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of October 21. (Rel. 34-29854)

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-90-05) filed by the Options Clearing Corporation providing that OCC will guarantee options transactions at the time the transactions are reported as matched to OCC clearing members. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of October 28. (Rel. 34-29853)

#### PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>American Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-91-25) under Rule 19b-4 to adopt a new section of the <u>Company Guide</u> to establish listing criteria for an <u>Emerging Company Marketplace</u> (ECM). Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of October 28. (Rel. 34-29851)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Sectio 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
