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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### HELANE MORRISON NAMED HEAD OF THE SEC'S SAN FRANCISCO DISTRICT OFFICE

Chairman Arthur Levitt today announced the selection of Helane L. Morrison as District Administrator of the Securities and Exchange Commission's San Francisco District Office. The San Francisco Office is part of the Commission's Pacific Region, which is headquartered in Los Angeles. In her capacity as District Administrator, Ms. Morrison will manage the enforcement and examination programs within the San Francisco Office's jurisdiction.

Ms. Morrison joined the Commission in 1996 as Assistant District Administrator in the San Francisco District Office with responsibility for overseeing the Office's enforcement program. In that capacity, she supervised a number of significant investigations, including investigations that resulted in enforcement actions against Republic Securities of New York, Dean Witter, and the auditors of California Micro Devices.

Prior to joining the Commission, Ms. Morrison was a partner in the San Francisco law firm of Howard, Rice, Nemerovski, Canady, Falk & Rabkin, and served as judicial law clerk to Justice Harry A. Blackmun, United States Supreme Court, and Judge Richard A. Posner, United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. Ms. Morrison earned a B.S. at Northwestern University in 1975 and a J.D. from the University of California-Berkeley (Boalt Hall) in 1984.

Chairman Arthur Levitt said, "I am very pleased that Helane Morrison has agreed to serve as District Administrator of our San Francisco Office. Helane is a very talented lawyer with excellent experience. She has proven to be a fine manager in administering a vibrant enforcement program in that Office. I am confident that she will carry out the responsibilities of this important position with intelligence and effectiveness, and I look forward to continuing to work with her."

Richard H. Walker, Director of the SEC's Division of Enforcement, said, "Helane has been a highly effective leader of the San Francisco District Office's enforcement program for the past three years. She brings to her new position as District Administrator a

vast reservoir of talent, knowledge, and expertise."

Valerie Caproni, Regional Director of the SEC's Pacific Regional Office, said, "Helane is a great asset to the Commission. She is creative and aggressively pursues the public interest in enforcement cases. She will do an excellent job as the new head of the District Office."

Ms. Morrison, 46, succeeds David B. Bayless, who left the Commission in May 1999 to practice law in the private sector. (Press Rel. 99-105)

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## **ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS**

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### **SEC CENSURES THREE TRANSFER AGENTS FOR FAILING TO FILE YEAR 2000 REPORTS**

On August 26, the Commission censured three transfer agents for failing to file reports about their Year 2000 preparedness efforts. Alpha Tech Stock Transfer based in Utah, Manor Investment Funds based in Pennsylvania, and United Stock Transfer based in Colorado failed to file all or part of Form TA-Y2K in 1998 as mandated by the Commission in furtherance of its efforts to ensure that investors receive timely information about the Year 2000 preparedness efforts being made by all segments of the securities industry. All three firms consented to the entry of the order, which in addition to a censure requires each to cease and desist from further violations of Sections 17(a)(3) and 17A(d)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 17Ad-18 thereunder. ### **COMMISSION SEEKS TO COMPEL BEACHPORT ENTERTAINMENT CORPORATION TO FILE DELINQUENT REPORTS**

On August 27, the Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Beachport, Inc. (Beachport), an issuer whose securities are traded on the OTC Bulletin Board. The complaint alleges that Beachport, a company that develops and produces live family entertainment, failed to make available to the investing public current and accurate information about its financial condition and results of operations through the filing of periodic reports with the Commission as required by the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Specifically, the complaint alleges that Beachport has not filed its Annual Report on Form 10-K for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1998, its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for the fiscal quarters ended March 31, September 30 and December 31, 1998 and March 31, 1999. Beachport also has filed late its quarterly report for the fiscal quarter ended September 30, 1997 and has failed to file six Notifications of Late Filing for its delinquent reports. The Commission seeks to compel Beachport to file its delinquent periodic reports and enjoin Beachport from further violations of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 12b-25, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder. **SEC SETTLES INTERNET HOAX CASE**

Gary D. Hoke, Jr., the alleged perpetrator of a widely publicized internet hoax, has consented to the entry of a final judgment by the United States District Court for the Central District of California, permanently enjoining him from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Based upon Hoke's financial condition, the final judgment does not provide for a monetary penalty.

The SEC's complaint charged that on April 7, 1999, Hoke, under an assumed name, posted a message on a World Wide Web page falsely reporting that the public company PairGain Technologies, Inc. was being bought by an Israeli company. That posting provided a direct internet link to what appeared to be a Bloomberg News Service web page announcing the acquisition. In fact, this page was a fabrication created by Hoke. The publication of this false Bloomberg report caused a substantial increase in the market price of PairGain securities. After the report was exposed as a hoax, the price of PairGain securities declined precipitously.

The Commission wishes to acknowledge the assistance of the Office of the United States Attorney for the Central District of California and the Federal Bureau of Investigation during the investigation of this matter. 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**INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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**THE AMERICAN FRANKLIN LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 20, 1999, to request a hearing on an application filed by The American Franklin Life Insurance Company (American Franklin) and Separate Account VUL of American Franklin (collectively Applicants). The Applicants seek an order pursuant to Section 26(b) of the Investment Company Act approving the substitution of securities issued by six newly-organized portfolios of EQ Advisors Trust for securities issued by six portfolios of The Hudson River Trust and currently used as the underlying investment options for certain variable life insurance policies issued by American Franklin. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### INTERSTATE ENERGY CORPORATION, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Interstate Energy Corporation (Interstate), a registered holding company, and its nonutility subsidiaries. Interstate proposes, directly or through one or more of its nonutility subsidiaries, through December 31, 2001, to: (1) engage in various external and intrasystem financing transactions; (2) organize and acquire intermediate subsidiaries; (3) construct or acquire assets incidental to the oil and gas exploration and production and energy marketing, brokering and trading operations of the subsidiaries; (4) engage in various interest-rate hedging transactions; (5) pay dividends out of capital and unearned surplus; (6) sell goods and services to nonutility associates at fair market prices; and (7) engage in certain business activities permitted by Rule 58 both within and outside the United States. The Commission has reserved jurisdiction over (1) the issuance of certain securities by Interstate and its subsidiaries; (2) the transfer of any financing proceeds by a financing subsidiary to Interstate; (3) energy marketing activities of Rule 58 subsidiaries performed outside the United States and Canada; and (4) all other activities of Rule 58 subsidiaries performed outside the United States. ### NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued extending through December 31, 1999, the effective period of an order issued May 12, 1999 authorizing National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, and its wholly owned nonutility subsidiary, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation, to acquire substantially all the assets of Cunningham Natural Gas Corporation in exchange for National common stock.
