# Conference



The National Conference on Volunteering and Service is the world's largest gathering of volunteer and service leaders. The 2008 conference will convene June 1<sup>st</sup> thru 3<sup>rd</sup> in Atlanta, home to many leaders and organizations in the civil rights, social justice and volunteer movement.

A lot of thought went into this year's theme choice which was inspired by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. In April, more than 40 years ago Dr. King said:

We are now faced with the fact, my friends, that tomorrow is today. We are confronted with the fierce urgency of now. In this unfolding conundrum of life and history, there is such a thing as being too late. Procrastination is still the thief of time. Life often leaves us standing bare, naked, and dejected with a lost opportunity. The tide in the affairs of men does not remain at flood—it ebbs. We may cry out desperately for time to pause in her passage, but time is adamant to every plea and rushes on. Over the bleached bones and jumbled residues of numerous civilizations are written the pathetic words, "Too late." There is an invisible book of life that faithfully records our vigilance or our neglect. Omar Khayyam is right: "The moving finger writes, and having writ moves on. We still have a choice today: nonviolent coexistence or violent co-annihilation. We must move past indecision to action."

This year the theme is "The Urgency of Now". The theme is a call to action for a new generation of civic leaders. Now is the time to seize the growing momentum for service and unleash the power of citizens to make a better world.

# **CONFERENCE REGISTRATION**

- Registration is now open.
- You will select your conference agenda when you register for the conference. If you register before April 30, the fee is \$350, which includes \$300 for the National Conference and \$50 for activities specifically geared to AmeriCorps. After April, the registration fee goes up to \$450.
- Workshop pre-registration is required. Please review the AmeriCorps Sessions before you attempt to register. Once registered you will be issued a bar code that you must bring with you. At each session your bar code will be scanned for admission to that session.
- Registering for AmeriCorps Sessions: The AmeriCorps Grantee meeting registration is integrated into the overall registration for the National Conference on Volunteering and Service. The official AmeriCorps grantee meeting starts on Sunday, June 1, 2008 with the AmeriCorps State and National Town Hall luncheon. This will be followed by individual AmeriCorps State Commission Meeting and AmeriCorps National Grantee Meeting.

#### WHAT'S NEW?

This year's registration fees are lower than last year's, beginning at \$300.

Conference confirmation page & name badges will have bar codes printed on them.

To be admitted to a session you must have your Name Tag with bar code available. It will be scanned at the door and only those who pre-registered for the session will be admitted. If a session is not full, admission will open to people not previously registered.
