Competitiveness Demonstration Program: Set-Aside Authority for Fiscal Year (FY) 2009



The set-aside policy for the Small Business Competitiveness Demonstration Program for FY 2009 supersedes all previous set-aside policies for this program. This policy covers the period from October 1, 2008, through September 30, 2009, unless superseded by a memorandum from the Department of Agriculture (USDA), Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization (OSDBU).

DESIGNATED INDUSTRY GROUPS (DIG's)

Set-Asides for Small Business Concerns

Small business set-asides are required for the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Codes and Product/Service Codes (PSC) under the Competitiveness Demonstration Program as listed in Attachment 1. Acquisition of the listed Designated Industry Groups that require a set-aside for the Agricultural Research Service shall be conducted under the small business set-aside authority.

Set-Aside Priority for 8(a), HUBZone, SDVOSB and Emerging Small Businesses (ESB)

The 8 (a), Historically Underutilized Business Zone (HUBZone) and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) concerns shall have priority in the awarding of all contracts under the Competitiveness Demonstration Program. All procurements under the ESB reserve threshold shall be set-aside for competition by ESB concerns for architect-engineering services (\$50,000 and below) and all others (\$30,000 and below).

TARGETED INDUSTRY CATEGORIES (TIC's)

All acquisitions of products in the TIC's are required to be set-aside for exclusive participation by small business concerns. TIC's are listed in Attachment 1. All TIC procurements, regardless of dollar value, shall continue to be considered for Small Business, 8(a), HUBZone, and SDVOSB set-asides.

We must notify the USDA-OSDBU if a TIC requirement will not be set-aside for small business concerns. A copy of the solicitation and justification for not setting-aside the requirement must be forwarded to the Research, Education, and Economics (REE), OSDBU Coordinator, for review prior to being submitted to the Department.

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ARS ANNUAL SET-ASIDE POLICY – FY 2009 DESIGNATED INDUSTRY GROUPS (DIGS) & TARGETED INDUSTRY CATEGORIES (TICS)

<u>Designated Industry Groups (DIGs)</u> <u>FAR 19.1005(a)</u>

The Small Business Competitiveness Demonstration Program (FAR Subpart 19.10) is intended to test the effectiveness of eliminating small business set-asides in certain industries designated by North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes and NAICS-Product Service Code (PSC) combinations referred to collectively as Designated Industry Groups (DIGS).

In general, solicitations for acquisitions in the DIGs <u>may not</u> be set-aside for small business with the following exceptions:

- 1 Solicitations for acquisitions in the designated industry groups with an estimated value up to the emerging small business (ESB) reserve amount <u>must</u> be set aside for ESBs in accordance with the procedures at FAR 19.1007 paragraph c:
 - ESB Reserve Amount \$30,000 for construction, refuse systems and related services, non-nuclear ship repair, landscaping and pest control services.
 - ESB Reserve Amount \$50,000 for architectural and engineering services.
- 2 Solicitations for acquisitions greater than the ESB reserve amount in *ALL* designated industry groups <u>must continue to be considered</u> for placement under the 8(a) Program (FAR Subpart 19.8), the HUBZone Program (FAR Subpart 19.13), and the Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Procurement Program (FAR Subpart 19.14).
- 3 Solicitations issued from the following agencies with a NAICS/PSC combination indicated below should be set-aside for Small Business pursuant to FAR Subpart 19.5:
