New IAS Password Rules

Effective May 5, 2008, all Integrated Acquisition System (IAS) passwords must follow the rules below:

- Passwords must be at least 12 characters long.
- Passwords are case sensitive. You can enter mixed cases, all upper cases or all lower cases. It is recommended to use mixed case passwords for better security.
- Passwords must contain at least one letter and one number. These letters and numbers can be anywhere in the password.
- Passwords must not contain repeating characters. For example, password GreenZone123 is invalid as letter 'e' is repeating.
- Passwords must not contain the username.
- You can use special characters (e.g. \$, @) in the passwords, but this is not mandatory.
- Once logged into the system, you can change the password as many times as you want.
- Passwords automatically expire after 60 days from the previous password reset date. On the 61st day, upon entering the old password, the system prompts you to reset the password.
- The same password cannot be reused for 365 days.
- If you fail to log in to the system after 5 attempts, the system locks your account.
 Contact the REE Tier 0 support, or the IAS helpdesk to unlock your account.

Effective May 5, 2008, you will need to log in to IAS as follows:

• <u>IAS Contracts (PRISM)</u>: Enter your user-name and old password in <u>UPPER</u> case. The system may prompt you to change the password based on your previous reset date. Follow the above password rules to change the password.

• <u>IAS Requisitions, Receiving, Invoice and DRM modules</u>: Enter your user-name and old password. The system may prompt you to change the password based on your previous reset date. Follow the above password rules to change the password.
