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COMMENT SOUGHT ON ASCENT MEDIA GROUP PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OF THE WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU'S ORDER DISMISSING ASCENT'S REQUEST FOR REVIEW OF A USAC DECISION

On January 14, 2009, Ascent Media Group (Ascent) filed an application for review of the Wireline Competition Bureau's (Bureau) order released on December 15, 2008, dismissing as moot Ascent's request for review of the decision of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) concerning waiver of the FCC Form 499-Q filing deadline, and denying Ascent's request for waiver of late payment charges based on that filing. Ascent argues in its petition that the contribution obligations assessed against it violate section 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended; that precedent exists to waive the FCC Form 499-A filing deadline; and Ascent's failure to pay its universal service contribution obligations did not negatively impact the fund. Ascent requests that the Commission reconsider and reverse the Bureau's order, and cancel the late payment penalties associated with its August 2007 FCC Form 499-Q filing.

Interested parties may file **comments on or before April 20, 2009**, and **reply comments on or before May 5, 2009**. All pleadings are to reference **WC Docket No. 06-122**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.⁴
