PETITION FOR RULEMAKING AND REQUEST FOR DECLARATORY RULING FILED BY THE COALITION UNITED TO TERMINATE FINANCIAL ABUSES OF THE TELEVISION TRANSITION, LLC

The Coalition United to Terminate Financial Abuses of the Television Transition, LLC ("CUT FATT" or "petitioner"), has filed a petition for rulemaking pursuant to Section 1.401of the Commission's rules¹ and a request for declaratory ruling pursuant to Section 154(i) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act").² In the petition for rulemaking, CUT FATT seeks a modification of the Commission's rules and policies regarding digital television patent licensing. In the request for declaratory ruling, CUT FATT requests that the Commission declare that it will treat violations of the patent licensing requirements in the same way that it treats other violations related to the digital television transition. We seek comment on CUT FATT's petition for rulemaking and request for declaratory ruling.

This proceeding will be treated as "permit but disclose" for purposes of the Commission's *ex parte* rules. *See generally* 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.1200-1.1216. As a result of the permit-but-disclose status of this proceeding, *ex parte* presentations will be governed by the procedures set forth in Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules applicable to non-restricted proceeding.³

Comments and oppositions are due April 27, 2009. All filings should refer to MB Docket No. 09-23 and must be submitted in MB Docket No. 09-23. Pleadings sent via e-mail to the Commission will be considered informal and will not be part of the official record. Comments and oppositions filed must indicate that they have been served on Petitioner. All comments and oppositions must be served on counsel for Petitioner:

Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies.⁴

Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/ or the Federal eRulemaking Portal: http://www.regulations.gov. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.
