TO HOLD 700 MHz REGIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY PLANNING MEETING**

The Region 33 (Ohio) 700 MHz Public Safety Regional Planning Committee (RPC) will hold its next meeting on Wednesday, March 11, 2009, beginning at 1:30 p.m. at the MARCS Program Offices, 2323 West 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Suite 150, Columbus, Ohio.

The agenda for the 700 MHz meeting includes:

In addition, Region 33 will hold its annual meeting and election of officers on Wednesday, September 9, 2009. The annual meeting shall be held in conjunction with the September meeting of the Ohio Chapter of the Association of Public Safety Communications Officials, Inc.

All Region 33 Public Safety RPC meetings are open to the public. It is essential that public safety agencies in all areas of government, including state, municipality, county, and Native American Tribal, and non-governmental organizations eligible under Section 90.523 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 90.523, be represented in order to ensure that each agency's future spectrum needs are considered in the allocation process. Administrators who are not oriented in the communications field should delegate someone with this knowledge to attend, participate, and represent their agency's needs.
