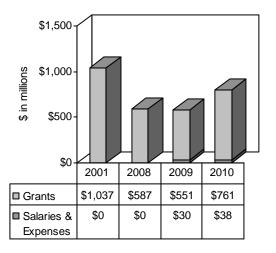

Mission:

The mission of the COPS Office is to advance the practice of community policing as an effective strategy to improve public safety. By addressing the root causes of criminal and disorderly behavior, rather than simply responding to crimes once they have been committed, community policing concentrates on preventing both crime and the atmosphere of fear it creates. Additionally, community policing encourages the use of crime-fighting technology and operational strategies and the development of mutually beneficial relationships between law enforcement and the community. By earning the trust of the members of their communities and making those individuals stakeholders in their own safety, law enforcement can better understand and address the community's needs, and the factors that contribute to crime.

Resources:

The budget request for FY 2010 totals \$798.5 million, which is a 37.5 percent increase from the FY 2009 enacted level. In FY 2009, the organization also received \$1 billion in supplemental funds for the Recovery Act of 2009.



Funding (FY 2001 - 2010)

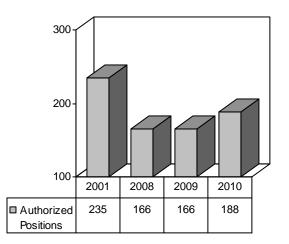
Organization:

COPS is headed by a Director, who is appointed by the Attorney General. The COPS Office was established in 1994 to assist law enforcement agencies in enhancing public safety through the implementation of community policing strategies.

Personnel:

The COPS' direct authorized positions for FY 2010 total 188 positions. COPS' FY 2010 request includes an increase of 22 positions over the FY 2009 level of 166 direct authorized positions.





FY 2010 Strategy:

Over the past decade, the programs and initiatives developed by the COPS Office have provided funding to more than 13,000 of the Nation's 18,000 law enforcement agencies. Approximately 81% of the Nation's population is served by law enforcement agencies practicing community policing. To-date COPS has funded nearly 117,000 officers. With funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, the COPS Office estimates approximately 5,500 additional law enforcement officer jobs will be created or saved in law enforcement agencies across the country.

More than 500,000 law enforcement personnel and community members have been trained on community policing topics including crime control strategies, police ethics and integrity, terrorism prevention and preparedness, school safety, partnership building, problemsolving and crime analysis.

In FY 2010, the COPS Office will continue to fulfill its mission of advancing the practice of community policing by:

- Funding additional officers;
- Continuing to support innovative programs that respond directly to the emerging needs of state, local, and tribal law enforcement, to shift law enforcement's focus to preventing, rather than reacting to crime and disorder within their communities;
- Developing state-of-the-art training and technical assistance to enhance law enforcement officers' problem-solving and community interaction skills; Promoting collaboration between law enforcement and community members to develop innovative initiatives to prevent crime; and
- Providing responsive, cost-effective service delivery to COPS' grantees to ensure success in advancing community policing strategies within their communities.

FY 2010 Program Changes:

Programs Administered by the COPS Office:

COPS Hiring: A total of \$298 million to respond to the demand from state, local, and tribal governments for COPS hiring funding. This enhancement will be used to continue to support the efforts of state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies in meeting the challenge of keeping their communities safe. The officers supported through this funding will be incorporated into meeting the Administration's goal of increasing law enforcement personnel by 50,000. FY 2010 current services resources for this initiative is \$0.

Community Policing Development: An increase of \$12 million for a total of \$16 million to fund a variety of innovative projects and knowledge resource products that support the integration of community policing strategies throughout the law enforcement community that enable officers and community members to more effectively address emerging law enforcement and community issues. FY 2010 current services resources for this initiative is \$4 million.

Police Integrity: A total of \$20 million to improve police-community relationships and strengthen community trust in law enforcement. Some areas of potential focus for this funding include reducing racial profiling, early intervention systems for law enforcement personnel, protecting civil rights, and examining police relationships with immigrant communities. FY 2010 current services resources for this initiative is \$0.

Salaries and Expenses: 22 positions and \$6 million to address the additional workload anticipated as a result of an expanded COPS Program. A total of \$37.5 million is requested for COPS Salaries and Expenses. FY 2010 current services resources for this initiative is \$31.5 million.

Programs Administered by the Office of Justice Programs:

Coverdell Grants: An increase of \$10 million for a total of \$35 million to award grants to states and units of local government to improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner services. FY 2010 current services resources for this initiative is \$25 million.

Second Chance Prisoner Reentry: An increase of \$75 million for a total of \$100 million for adult and juvenile offender demonstration projects, mentoring grants to nonprofit organizations, and research to increase knowledge of effective re-entry strategies. These three initiatives will help ensure the successful transition of people from prison and jail, thereby making communities safer and improving overall public safety. FY 2010 current services resources for this initiative is \$25 million.

Savings:

Offsetting funding decreases from the DNA Program (\$5 million reduction), the heavily earmarked COPS Technology Grants Program (\$187 million program elimination), and the heavily earmarked COPS Methamphetamine Program (\$12.5 million reduction) have been included in the budget. In addition, a savings of \$40 million is achieved from rescinding projected unobligated recoveries from COPS prior year appropriations.
