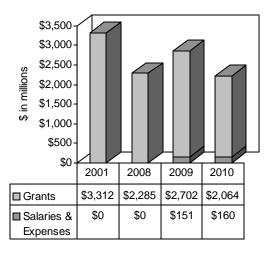
Mission:

The mission of OJP is to increase safety and improve the fair administration of justice across America through innovative leadership and programs. OJP strives to make the nation's criminal and juvenile justice systems more responsive to the needs of state, local, and tribal governments and their citizens. It partners with Federal, state, and local agencies, and national and community-based organizations, including faith-based organizations, to develop, operate and a wide range of criminal and juvenile justice programs.

Resources:

The budget request for FY 2010 totals \$2,224.3 million, which is a 22 percent decrease from the FY 2009 enacted level. The budget discontinues funding for earmarks and State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) and focuses funding on programs that directly reduce crime. In FY 2009, the organization also received \$2,761.9 million in supplemental funds for the Recovery Act of 2009.

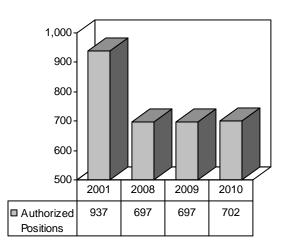


Organization:

OJP is headed by an Assistant Attorney General (AAG) who promotes coordination among OJP bureaus and offices. OJP has five component bureaus: the Bureau of Justice Assistance, the Bureau of Justice Statistics, the National Institute of Justice, the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, and the Office for Victims of Crime. Additionally, OJP has two program offices: the Community Capacity Development Office, which incorporates the Weed and Seed strategy, and the Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, Apprehending, Registering, and Tracking (SMART). The AAG and all OJP bureau heads are presidentially appointed and confirmed by the Senate.

Personnel:

The OJP's direct authorized positions for FY 2010 total 702 positions. OJP's FY 2010 request includes an increase of 5 positions, over the FY 2009 level of 697 direct authorized positions.

FY 2010 Strategy:

Although OJP does not directly carry out law enforcement and justice activities, its role is to work in partnership with the justice community to identify the most pressing challenges confronting the justice system and provide high quality knowledge through innovative research and development.

Significant challenges continue to confront the justice system, including:

Violent crime continues to be a major challenge, especially when commingled with the problems of gangs and drugs. OJP promotes multi-jurisdictional, multidivisional, and multi-disciplinary programs and partnerships that increase the capacity of communities to prevent and control these serious crime problems.

Repeat offenders who cycle in and out of the justice system commit a significant portion of all crime and drive up the cost of operating justice agencies. These offenders often have risk factors such as mental health problems and substance abuse, limited education and literacy, inadequate job skills, and a lack of positive support systems that, if addressed, reduce the likelihood of re-offending. OJP addresses these issues with two strategies: 1) community-based options for less serious offenders, such as problem-solving courts; and 2) intensive, multi-phase reentry programs for those who are incarcerated.

OJP is working to prevent and reduce youth involvement in gangs by addressing specific risk and protective factors associated with the likelihood of delinquent behavior and the needs and desires that underlie the decision to join a gang. The recidivism rate among juveniles following release from secure or other residential placement remains alarmingly high. OJP strives to strengthen the capability and capacity of our juvenile justice system to confront these challenges through prevention and intervention.

FY 2010 Program Changes:

Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS)'s National Crime Victimization Survey (NCVS): \$15 million to initiate implementation of a redesigned methodology for the NCVS consistent with the recommendations of the National Academy of Sciences. The NCVS provides national data on the extent of crime both reported and not reported to law enforcement as well as the characteristics and consequences of such victimization to the American public. A total of \$41 million is requested for the NCVS. FY 2010 current services for this initiative is \$26 million.

Community-Based Violence Prevention Initiative:

A total of \$25 million is requested to fund programs that adopt a comprehensive public health approach that investigates the causes of youth violence and implements a community-based strategy to prevent youth violence by addressing both the symptoms and causes of neighborhood violence. There are no FY 2010 current services for this initiative.

Drug, Mental Health and Problem-Solving Courts:

An increase of \$9 million is requested for a total of \$59 million to assist state, local, and tribal governments in developing multi-faceted strategies that bring courts together with other criminal justice, social services, and public health agencies to develop system-wide responses to offenders affected by underlying social and psychological issues, such as substance abuse and mental disorders, that the traditional court system is not designed to effectively address. FY 2010 current services for this initiative is \$50 million.

Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program: An increase of \$20 million is requested for a total of \$30 million to provide grants to state, local, and tribal governments to help them develop residential substance abuse treatment programs in correctional facilities and community-based aftercare services for probationers and parolees. FY 2010 current services for this initiative is \$10 million.

Crime Victims Fund: \$65 million to increase funding for victims' services and victim-witness personnel for a total request of \$700 million. FY 2010 current services for this initiative is \$635 million.

Salaries and Expenses: 5 positions and \$6.8 million to address additional workload, including from the expansion of OJP's Second Chance Program, for which additional funds are requested in FY 2010. A total of \$160.2 million is requested for Salaries and Expenses.

FY 2010 Program Changes (cont):

OJP Programs Discussed Elsewhere in the Summary

Additional program funding for OJP's Second Chance and Paul Coverdell Programs and a program reduction of OJP's DNA Initiative are included in the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services appropriation.

Funding for OJP's Closed Circuit Television Grants is eliminated under the Office on Violence Against Women appropriation.

Savings:

Offsetting decreases from the Missing and Exploited Children's Program (\$10 million), the Justice Assistance Grant Program (\$27 million), Southwest Border Prosecutor Program (\$1 million), the Northern Border Prosecutor Initiative (\$3 million), Missing Alzheimer's Program (\$2 million), Economic and Cybercrime (\$18 million) and Part E Juvenile Justice Grants (\$82 million) have been included in the budget. In addition, Byrne Discretionary funding has been heavily earmarked and its funding (\$178.5 million) has been eliminated. The State Alien Assistance Program (\$400 million) is a partial subsidy for the cost of incarceration in state prisons and county jails of illegal aliens who have already committed crimes, but it does not help states and communities combat crime so its funding has been eliminated. A decrease of \$50 million is also included for the Public Safety Officers' Death Benefits Program, where claims are anticipated to decrease. An additional \$42 million in savings is achieved from rescinding projected unobligated recoveries from OJP prior year appropriations.
