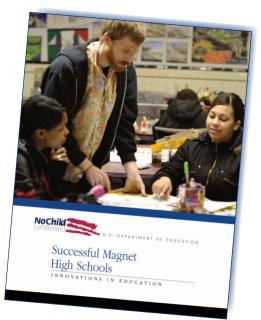


**Innovations In Education**
