
ORDER

The Securities and Exchange Commission remanded this matter on September 30, 2004, with an Order Remanding Proceeding to Administrative Law Judge. The hearing is scheduled to commence on February 1, 2005, at 9:30 a.m. MST, in Courtroom 2, Byron White U.S. Courthouse, 1823 Stout Street, Denver, Colorado. Under consideration is Respondent's Motion To Allow Telephonic Testimony (Motion) of three witnesses. In support of his Motion, Respondent states, inter alia, that the three witnesses do not live in Colorado, that the direct and cross examinations of these witnesses should take no more than two hours each, and that the Division of Enforcement (Division) does not object to the appearance of these witnesses by telephone. Respondent has notified the Division of the names and telephone numbers of these witnesses.

Based on the above, the Motion is hereby GRANTED. Respondent's witnesses, Richard Lintz, Anita Mills Berry, and Robert Rugarber, will be permitted to testify telephonically.
