

The Securities and Exchange Commission remanded this matter on September 30, 2004, by an Order Remanding Proceeding to Administrative Law Judge. The hearing is scheduled to commence on February 1, 2005, at 9:30 a.m. MST, in Courtroom 2, Byron White U.S. Courthouse, 1823 Stout Street, Denver, Colorado. Under consideration is the Division of Enforcement's (Division) Motion To Allow Telephonic Testimony (Motion). In support of its Motion, the Division states, inter alia, that at least two proposed witnesses do not live in Colorado, that the direct and cross examinations of both of these witnesses should take no more than two hours, and that Respondent does not object to the appearance of these witnesses by telephone. The Division agrees to indicate on its witness list, due January 21, 2005, which of its witnesses will appear by telephone.

Based on the above, the Motion is GRANTED. The investor witnesses living outside Colorado will be permitted to testify by telephone.
