Dear Caribbean Colleagues:



As we draw to the close of 2008, many of us are concerned about the prospects for international trade and economic growth in the New Year.

Although such concerns are certainly understandable, the current situation reminds me about what occurred in Mexico shortly after I arrived at the American Consulate General in Monterrey in July of 1994. At the end of that year, the infamous "Tequila Crisis" occurred in Mexico, causing a drastic economic contraction of about eight percent during the course of 1985.

Our U.S. Commercial Service Office in Monterrey organized an annual trade show called "REPCOM Monterrey," which had consisted of over 150 U.S. company participants in the March 1994 event; however, only 24 U.S. firms exhibited in the March 1985 event, due to the belief that there was no possibility of doing business as a result of the economic crisis (even the 24 companies that did exhibit told us that they only did so in the hope of developing opportunities in the long-term).

The interesting point is that virtually all 24 of those U.S. exhibitors did business with their Mexican counterparts in the short-term, to their surprise. After meeting with Mexican companies and discussing the competitive advantages each of them brought to the table, they realized how they could work together to develop international business opportunities.

That is the purpose of the CBO newsletter and of our U.S. Commercial Service programs and activities – to facilitate the establishment of relationships between U.S. firms and Caribbean companies – because together those companies will be able to combine resources, technology and market knowledge in order to create new international business opportunities.

We look forward to supporting your efforts in 2009 to facilitate the development of such new opportunities. Best wishes to you and your families for a very Joyous Holiday Season and a New Year full of happiness, health and peace.

# **Agency Profile**



USTDA is an independent U.S. Government foreign assistance agency that is funded by the U.S. Congress.

Their mission is to promote economic growth in developing and middle income countries, while simultaneously helping American businesses to export their products and services, thereby creating U.S. jobs. In addition, USTDA supports U.S. policy objectives related to development and capacity building activities.

USTDA provides grant funding to overseas project sponsors for the planning of projects that support the development of modern infrastructure and an open trading system. The hallmark of USTDA development assistance has always involved building partnerships between U.S. companies and overseas project sponsors to bring proven private sector solutions to developmental challenges.

In Fiscal Year 2008, USTDA obligated over \$46 million in support of the development goals of project sponsors in 54 host counties around the world. Last year, USTDA funded 67 technical assistance activities, 41 feasibility studies, and 24 orientation visits. The average size of a USTDA grant is \$400,000.

While the agency's activities span a wide variety of sectors, many focus on transportation, energy and power, water and the environment, health care, mining and natural resources, telecommunications, and information technology.

#### PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

The hallmark of the agency involves building partnerships between U.S. companies and overseas project sponsors to bring proven private sector solutions to developmental challenges. The agency delivers its program commitments through overseas grants, contracts with U.S. firms, and the use of trust funds at several multilateral development bank groups.

USTDA's program is designed to help countries establish a favorable trading environment and a modern infrastructure that promotes sustainable economic development. To this en d, the agency funds overseas project sponsor access to U.S. private sector expertise in the areas of: 1) trade capacity building and sector development; and 2) project definition and investment analysis.

- Trade Capacity Building and Sector Development: supports the establishment of industry standards, rules and regulations, trade agreements, market liberalization and other policy reform.
- Project Definition and Investment Analysis: involves activities that support large capital investments that contribute to overseas infrastructure development.







#### SUBMITTING A PROPOSAL TO USTDA

If you are developing a project or initiative that you would like USTDA to consider for possible grant assistance, you should begin by:

- 1. Contacting the appropriate USTDA Regional Director or Country Manager (see below) or,

To formally initiate USTDA consideration of a project, a project sponsor should direct a request to USTDA following the guidelines of USTDA's *Model Proposal Format for Overseas Applicants.* In cases where a specific U.S. company has been identified as a partner or preferred supplier on the project, the U.S. Company submits a separate, detailed proposal to USTDA following the *Model Proposal Format for U.S. Companies* guidelines.

USTDA evaluates project proposals primarily based on:

- Their priority to the project sponsors and the countries where they are located and their likelihood of receiving implementation financing or, in the case of USTDA's trade capacity building work, advancing trade liberalization efforts; and
- 2. Whether they offer mutual economic benefit for the host country and the United States, including opportunities for commercial cooperation with U.S. firms.

There is no set deadline for projects to be considered. Because of the high demand for USTDA funding, not all proposals that meet USTDA funding criteria can be supported.
