

Supplemental Private School Tables, by Affiliation Stratum for the 2003-04 Schools and Staffing Survey Report: NCES 2006-313

The tables included in this document are Supplemental Private School Tables, by Affiliation Stratum, and supplement the report titled *Characteristics of Schools, Districts, Teachers, Principals, and School Libraries in the United States: 2003-04 Schools and Staffing Survey* (NCES 2006-313). While the tables in the report provide 2003-04 SASS data by school type and selected school characteristics, the tables in this supplement include the same information by private school affiliation stratum. There are 37 private school affiliation stratum tables and the corresponding standard error tables. The affiliation stratum tables apply to private schools, private school teachers, and private school principals. For more information about the content of these tables, please see the main report (NCES 2006-313).
