## **Habitat Projects in 2009**

The Service's Fisheries Program will provide approximately \$2.5 million to support onthe-ground, cost-share projects under the Action Plan in 2009. A slate of 51 projects in 25 States has been selected by the Regions to address priorities of the six Fish Habitat Partnerships organized under the Action Plan. Service funds will be matched by more than \$4.7 million from partners. In addition, the Service will direct \$246,100 to address priorities of the Western Native Trout Initiative in the Green River Basin, Wyoming, under the DOI Healthy Lands Initiative. Funds for the projects will be allocated to the Regions after Congress enacts the 2009 appropriations, currently moving through the House of Representatives as H.R. 1105, the "Omnibus Appropriations Act, 2009".

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act signed by President Obama on February 17 may also provide funds for Action Plan projects using a portion of the Service's \$280 million appropriation. The Regions identified a slate of projects that address priorities of Fish Habitat Partnerships while also meeting requirements of the Act to create the largest number of jobs in the shortest period of time. # National "One-Year-Out" Workshop scheduled for June

Many people and organizations are working in concert to implement the Action Plan, expending significant funding and effort. Approved in 2006, the Action Plan lays out several objectives that are due to be achieved in 2010:

- Conduct a condition analysis of all fish habitats within the United States by 2010.
- Identify priority fish habitats and establish Fish Habitat Partnerships targeting these habitats by 2010.
- Establish 12 or more Fish Habitat Partnerships throughout the United States by 2010.
- Prepare a "Status of Fish Habitats in the United States" report in 2010 and every five years thereafter.

A national workshop is planned to bring together people involved in the Action Plan to enhance the likelihood that the 2010 milestones will be achieved. The workshop will be an opportunity for structured and informal communication among partners working to implement the Action Plan -- to review progress, renew commitment and enthusiasm, and make necessary adjustments to achieve the 2010 milestones.

The workshop is scheduled for June 23-25, 2009 at the National Conference Center (<a href="www.conferencecenter.com">www.conferencecenter.com</a>) near Dulles International Airport, just west of Washington DC. More information will be available soon. Service employees involved with the
