## FORMER BANKRUPTCY DEBTOR CONVICTED FOR FAILURE TO DISCLOSE LAWSUIT ON BANKRUPTCY SCHEDULES

Jackson, Mississippi - Acting U.S. Attorney Stan Harris and U.S. Trustee R. Michael Bolen, announced that Linda McWilliams Hardy was convicted of concealment of assets, commonly referred to as bankruptcy fraud. Specifically, Hardy was convicted of concealing a lawsuit in her bankruptcy case which was ultimately settled for $\$ 437,500.00$. Hardy filed a personal injury lawsuit on September 18, 2001, against GE Modular Space, doing business as Transport International Pool Corporation. Then, in 2003, and while the lawsuit was still pending, Hardy filed a Chapter 7 bankruptcy case and did not disclose the lawsuit. The lawsuit thereafter settled and Hardy received $\$ 225,036.62$ which she concealed from the Chapter 7 trustee.

Acting U.S. Attorney Harris noted that "Bankruptcy fraud is a serious criminal offense that can have substantial victim impact and will be vigorously prosecuted. In this case, there were multiple victims."

Hardy will be sentenced on June 26, 2009 at 9:00 am before the Honorable Henry T. Wingate, Chief U. S. District Court Judge for the Southern District of Mississippi. Hardy faces a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a maximum fine of $\$ 250,000$.

This case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Harold Brittain and by Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Sammye Tharp.
