## **Docks Installed at North Spit Boat Ramp**

NORTH BEND, Ore. – The docks at the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) boat ramp on the North Spit were installed earlier this week and are ready for public use. The docks are removed from the water each fall to prevent them from being damaged by winter storms, and then placed back in the water in the spring.
