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Tree Seedlings for Sale at BLM Office

NORTH BEND, Ore. – The Bureau of Land Management’s Coos Bay District Office is selling Douglas-fir, hemlock, and Western red cedar tree seedlings to the public on Mondays in March.

The BLM has completed a majority of their tree planting for the year and the surplus seedlings will be sold by the bag. Douglas-fir bags contain 100 seedlings and cost \$30. Hemlock bags contain 160 seedlings and cost \$48. Western red cedar bags contain 200 seedlings a cost \$60. A smaller number of seedlings are available for sale if requested. The seedlings are from Coos and Douglas County stock.
