Bosque del Apache National Wildlife Refuge Seeks Public Input on Proposed Youth and Mobility Impaired Turkey Hunt

Bosque del Apache National Wildlife Refuge is in the process of developing alternatives for a proposed Youth and Mobility Impaired Spring Turkey Hunt and is seeking public input as part of the process.

The Rio Grande Turkey population on the Bosque del Apache NWR has been determined to be healthy enough to sustain a limited hunt of up to 8 bearded turkey per season. Currently, the (Rio Grande) turkey is considered common and can be seen throughout the year in flocks of up to 30 to 100 birds apiece.

In 2008, a Public Use Review of the refuge's Visitor Services Program was held in consultation with representatives of the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish. It was recommended in the review to opening refuge lands for limited hunting of turkey. The review also suggested that the refuge consider making these hunts available to non-traditional audiences.
