Kindergarten – 2nd Grade

All programs run 30 minutes.

Our Changing Earth

Students will explore maps and landforms of the San Luis Valley and the Great Sand Dunes. (CDE Standards: Science 4.2, 4.3, Geography 1.1, 1.2, 3.1)

Habitat, Sweet Habitat

Students will be introduced to the components of habitat (food, water, shelter, and space) and play a short game matching Great Sand Dunes wildlife to its appropriate habitat. (CDE Standards: Science 3.1, 3.5)

History is a Mystery

Students will learn how historians and archeologists solve mysteries by using the clues left behind by people long ago. The class will "excavate" its own trash can and put together a Great Sand Dunes archeology puzzle. (CDE Standards: History 2.1, 2.2)

Reading With a Ranger

Students will read stories about National Park Rangers and the jobs they do. (CDE Standards: Reading 4.5, 4.6)

3rd - 5th Grade

All programs run 45 minutes.

Water Planet

Students will use various measuring tools to explore the dynamics of the water cycle and how it functions in the San Luis Valley and the Great Sand Dunes system.

(CDE Standards: Science 1.2, 2.4, 4.5, 4.6, Geography 3.2)

Animal Olympics

Students will explore the specialized parts of Great Sand Dunes wildlife and how those parts help those animals survive in their chosen habitat.

(CDE Standards: Science 3.1, 3.4)

Layers in Time

Students will learn the difference between observation and inference and how scientists use both to learn about the past. Students will perform a mini-excavation to reveal layers of artifacts buried in sand. (CDE Standards: History 1.1, 2.1, 2.2)

Sand Dunes Poetry

Students will construct simple poems and stories using the Great Sand Dunes as inspiration.

(CDE Standards: Reading 2.1, 2.3)

6th - 8th Grade

All programs run 45 minutes.

Rocks Rock!

Students will conduct scientific investigations of properties of rocks and soil materials present in the Great Sand Dunes system. (CDE Standards: Science 1.2, 1.3, 4.1)

The Key to Nature Study

Students will use dichotomous keys to identify and classify the diverse trees, flowers, and mammals found at Great Sand Dunes. (CDE Standards: Science 3.1,)

Living in the Past

Students will tour the history of human settlement at Great Sand Dunes and the surrounding San Luis Valley – from prehistoric mammoth-hunters to Spanish exploration to early ranching to park establishment.

(CDE Standards: History 1.2, 2.3, 3.1, 4.2)

Land In Literature

Students will read, analyze, and discuss passages in classic literature that examine the human relationship to land.

(CDE Standards: Reading 4.4, 4.5, 6.1, 6.2)
