MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Pursuant to Section 1.46 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.46, Comcast Corporation ("Comcast") and AT&T Corp. ("AT&T") hereby move for a seven-day extension of time for filing their reply comments in the above-captioned proceeding. As explained below, granting the extension would allow the applicants to present in their reply a more thorough analysis of the issues raised by commenters in this proceeding and thereby provide a more complete public record to aid the Federal Communications Commission ("Commission") in its decision-making process.

On February 28, 2002, Comcast and AT&T filed applications requesting consent to transfer to AT&T Comcast Corporation ("AT&T Comcast") control of certain licenses and authorizations held by the subsidiaries and affiliates of Comcast and AT&T's broadband business. These applications were filed pursuant to Sections 214 and 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. On March 29, 2002, the Commission released a Public Notice establishing April 29, 2002 as the deadline for filing comments or petitions to deny and May 14, 2002 as the deadline for filing oppositions or responses regarding these license transfers.¹

On April 29, 2002, more than 25 comments comprising over 700 pages were filed in this proceeding, some of which included substantial declarations prepared by economists. The current reply cycle requires the applicants to file their response to these submissions by May 14. In view of the volume of the commenters' filings, the applicants request a brief extension of seven days, to and including May 21, 2002, to file their reply comments.

This brief extension will enable the applicants to provide the Commission a more thorough and complete record regarding the issues raised by commenters, which will in turn assist the Commission in making an informed, reasoned decision regarding the procompetitive benefits of the proposed merger application. Moreover, because the proposed extension is short, it will not prejudice any parties.
