LEESVILLE, LA MAN PLEADS GUILTY TO THEFT ON A MILITARY RESERVATION

Defendant was a former employee of Coca-Cola

Lafayette, Louisiana . . .United States Attorney Donald W. Washington announced that **CHARLES E. KUNSKY**, age 45, of Anacoco, Louisiana, pleaded guilty today before United States District Judge Rebecca F. Doherty in U.S. District Court in Lafayette, Louisiana, to one felony count of theft on a military reservation.

KUNSKY admitted to stealing property owned by government contractor, Coca Cola Company, located on Fort Polk. The defendant, a former employee of Coca Cola, fabricated a key from memory to gain access to approximately 30 Coca Cola vending machines from which he stole monies over an 18-month period. Fort Polk is a U.S. Army military reservation acquired for the use of the United States and under the exclusive jurisdiction thereof which serves as home to the Joint Readiness Training Center.

KUNSKY faces a maximum penalty of not more than ten years, a fine of not more than \$3,000.00, or both, and a term of supervised release of not more than three years after release from

confinement. Sentencing in federal court is determined by the discretion of federal judges and the governing statute. Parole has been abolished in the federal system.

This case was investigated by the Central Investigative Division at Fort Polk and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Stephanie A. Finley.
