Recovery Act Program Plans developed by ETA are currently being reviewed by the Department ahead of their submission to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) by May 1, 2009. The Recovery Act Program Plans will be posted on Recovery.gov.
2	ETA developed estimates of the general revenue portion for the Recovery Act Emergency Unemployment Compensation (EUC08) for the month of May, and also state estimates of FAC benefit payments by states for transmission to the U.S. Treasury Department.
