Your Comments are Important

Please take the time to fill out our *Travel Management Comment Forms*. The information collected will help us better understand where different uses on public lands are occurring. We want to know the kinds of experiences users are looking for, the frequency of use across areas, and if there are areas with special value to people, and what those values are.

The reason we are asking you to provide map locations is so we can compile the information and create a GIS map that identifies where the types of uses and experiences are occurring as well as the locations where individuals have concerns.

This information will be very useful as we assess the potential impacts to the public from various management alternatives.

What Is Scoping?

For 45 days following the release of the Notice of Intent to prepare Travel Management Plan Amendment, the agency will accept comments during a process called "scoping". The public scoping process is intended to provide information about the project and to gather public comments. Public input is critical to the BLM planning process, and your detailed comments help us make informed decisions in managing your public lands.
