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GYPSUM IN AUGUST 2008

Producers mined 1.0 million metric tons (Mt) of gypsum in August 2008 (table 1). Output was 42% less than that of July 2008 and 51% less than that of August 2007. Synthetic gypsum production was 627,000 metric tons (t) in August 2008 (table 1), which was 13% less than that of July 2008 and 19% less than that of August 2007. Both mined and synthetic gypsum are used as raw material for wallboard. The wallboard industry is the leading domestic consumer of gypsum. During August 2008, synthetic gypsum accounted for about 26% of the 2.44-Mt total supply of gypsum in the United States. Sales of uncalcined gypsum in August 2008, mainly for portland cement manufacture and for agricultural uses, were 502,000 t (table 2), 45% more than those of July 2008 and 10% more than those of August 2007.

Output of calcined gypsum for August 2008 (table 1) was 1.55 Mt, 6% less than that of July 2008 and 21% less than that of August 2007. Sales of board products (table 2) were approximately 2.05 billion square feet (190 million square meters), 6% less than those of July 2008 and 26% less than those of August 2007.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, imports of crude gypsum in August 2008 were 794,000 t (table 3), 4% more than

those of July 2008 and 4% more than those of August 2007. The United States imported crude gypsum from three countries in August 2008. Of these imports, Canada accounted for 61%, followed by Mexico with 31%, and Spain with 8%.

Gypsum wallboard imports for August 2008 were 30,100 t, equivalent to 3.35 million square meters (36.1 million square feet). These imports were 16% more than those of July 2008 and 20% less than those of August 2007. The United States imported wallboard products from five countries in August 2008. Mexico accounted for 49% of these imports, followed by Canada with 47%, and China with 3%. Imports from Costa Rica and Germany were negligible. Wallboard exports to 33 countries and territories in August 2008 were 8,300 t, equivalent to 0.923 million square meters (9.9 million square feet). These exports were about 11% less than those of July 2008 and 4% less than those of August 2007. Most wallboard exports were shipped to 24 western hemisphere countries, with Mexico accounting for 33%, followed by Canada with 19%.

All percentages in this report were computed based on unrounded data.
