GYPSUM IN SEPTEMBER 2008

Producers mined 1.0 million metric tons (Mt) of gypsum in September 2008 (table 1). Output was the same for August 2008 and 51% less than that of September 2007. The significant decrease between 2007 and 2008 is likely the result of improved data analysis, not an actual decline in production, and should be interpreted within this context. Synthetic gypsum production was 721,000 metric tons (t) in September 2008 (table 1), which was 22% more than that of August 2008 and 2% more than that of September 2007. Both mined and synthetic gypsum are used as raw material for wallboard. The wallboard industry is the leading domestic consumer of gypsum. During September 2008, synthetic gypsum accounted for about 33% of the 2.19 millionmetric-ton (Mt) total supply of gypsum in the United States. Sales of uncalcined gypsum in September 2008, mainly for portland cement manufacture and for agricultural uses, were 604,000 t (table 2), 20% more than those of August 2008 and 23% more than those of September 2007.

Output of calcined gypsum for September 2008 (table 1) was 1.51 Mt, 3% less than that of August 2008 and 17% less than that of September 2007. Sales of board products (table 2) were approximately 187 million square meters (2.01 billion square feet), 2% less than those of August 2008 and 15% less than those of September 2007.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, imports of crude gypsum in September 2008 were 441,000 t (table 3), 45% less than those of August 2008 and 39% less than those of September 2007. The United States imported crude gypsum from three countries in September 2008. Of these imports, Canada accounted for 84%, followed by Mexico with 13%, and the Dominican Republic with 3%.

Gypsum wallboard imports for September 2008 were 27,600 t, equivalent to 3.07 million square meters (33 million square feet). These imports were 8% less than those of August 2008 and 4% more than those of September 2007. The United States imported wallboard products from four countries in September 2008. Canada accounted for 50% of these imports, followed by Mexico with 47%, and China with 3%. Imports from Indonesia were negligible. Wallboard exports to 28 countries and territories in September 2008 were 7,700 t, equivalent to 0.852 million square meters (9.2 million square feet). These exports were about 7% less than those of August 2008 and 9% more than those of September 2007. Most wallboard exports were shipped to 20 western hemisphere countries, with Mexico and Canada each accounting for 24%, followed by the Bahamas with 7%.

All percentages in this report were computed based on unrounded data.
