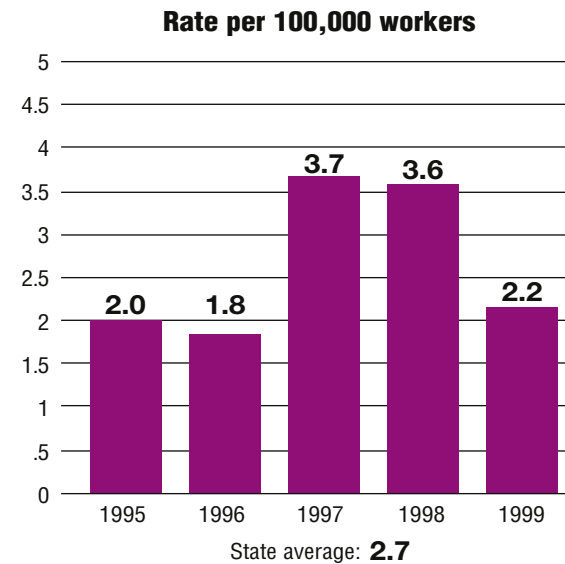

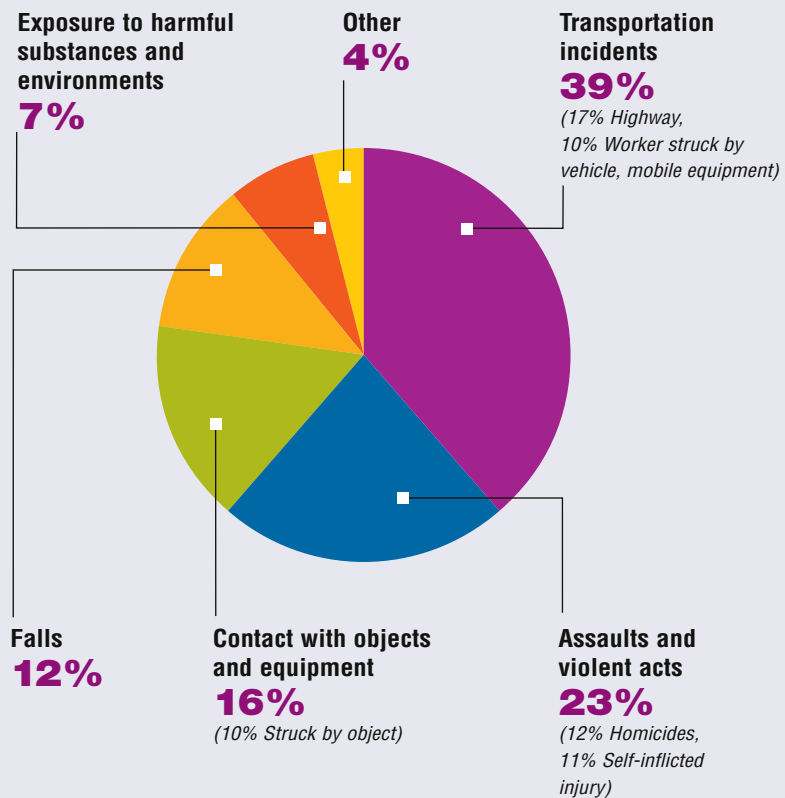

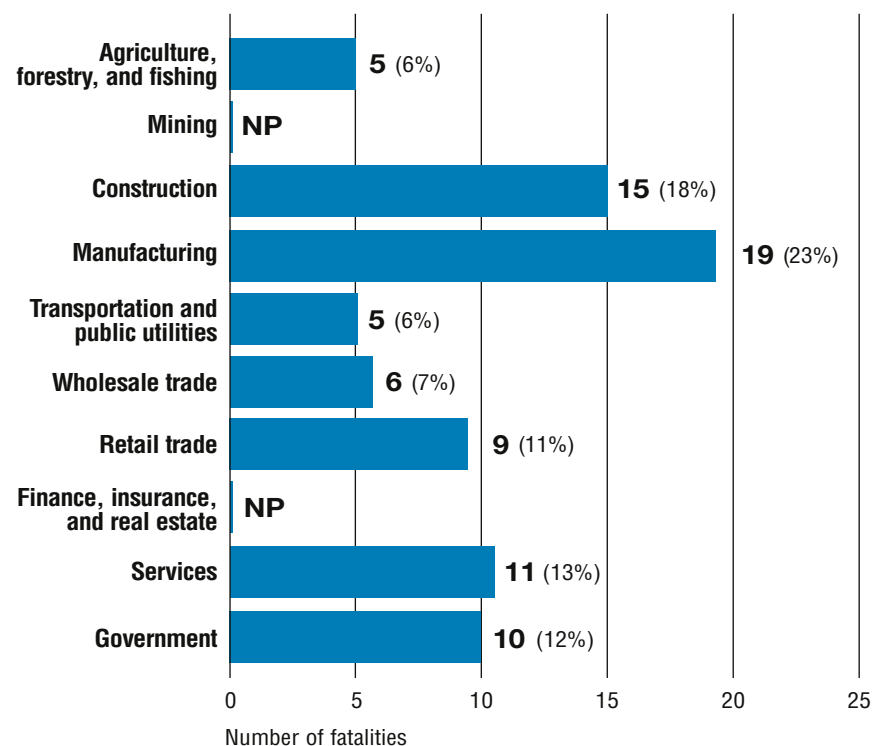


## OCCUPATIONS WITH THE MOST FATALITIES
