

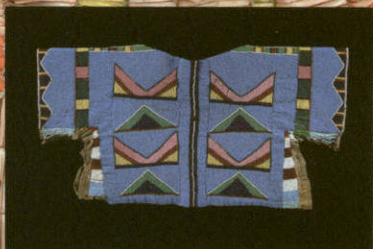
## Museum of the Plains Indian

The Museum of the Plains Indian displays richly varied arts of Northern Plains tribal peoples including the Blackfeet, Crow, Northern Cheyenne, Arapaho, Assiniboine, Sioux, Shoshone, Nez Perce, Flathead, Chippewa, and Cree. Their historic clothing, horse gear, weapons, household implements, baby carriers and toys highlight the exhibits.

A series of promotional sales exhibitions introduces unsurpassed contemporary American Indian arts and crafts by emerging artists and craftpersons.

Founded in 1941 the Museum is administered by the Indian Arts and Crafts Board, an agency of the U.S. Department of the Interior that promotes the development of contemporary American Indian and Alaska Native arts.
