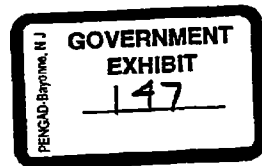

>of 'Explorer', which is the name of the Windows 95 shell.

>extension to the standard Win95 release is informally known as the PlusPack.

> - Plus! includes Internet email (really just a MAPI driver for
>Exchange), as well as an Internet Setup Wizard. this helps
>configure TCP/IP, PPP, general dialup stuff.

> - we are using this to drive MSN users who would normally use the
>X.25 network over to the new UUNet TCP/IP dialup network. MSN will
>be available as a Winsock/TCP-IP application at the same time the
>Plus! ships.
