Our "preferred" IE license means that the ISP agrees

- That IE will be the "preferred and default browser" they distribute to their customers (on all supported platforms)
- That they will announce this publicly within 30 days of signing
- That they report to us on a quarterly basis how many browsers they ship
- That they display the IE logo on their homepage

In return they get a free license to our browser, news and mail client, PPP stack and dialer on all platforms (this also includes new components for 3.0 like NetMeeting).

Technically they can also distribute other browsers but in fact very few do simply because of our better economics. Of the 2,500 signed I'll bet 2,000 only distribute our browser

I want to summarize where we are with IE 3.0 licensing and also our OLS folder and ISP referral server deals. I will try and send updates out on a weekly basis and also to include Normandy in future reports.

### Overall Progress:

- We have signed a grand total of about 2500 IE preferred licenses with netops and our total ISP database now contains 7500 IAPs ww
- 3 weeks after launching our broadreach program in Japan, 90 of the 350 ISPs we know of in Japan have licensed IE on a preferred basis
- We have signed a total of 7 ISP referral deals to date (covering 12 countries)
