Mike,

Here is a summary of what we need from Microsoft to be able to work on Muenster dial-up. The engineering contact that Troy has been working with is Tom Reardon (e-mailthomasre@microsoft.com, and phone # (206) 936-4061). He has also been in contact with Rob Williams (e-mail robwi@microsoft.com, and phone # (206) 936-3666) but Tom is the primary contact.

1. RNA (remote network access) phonebook API. Currently the only way to create/edit phonebook entries is through the Win 95 interface. Our product will need to create an RNA phonebook entry for the registration server (this would happen during install) and also to configure the customer's new account once the account has been created. To make these calls, Troy needs to have an API that will allow him to configure the required information.
2. Scripting capabilities to handle situations in which ISP is not using either PAP or CHAP for login (Portal for example does not use PAP or CHAP). In these situations Troy needs to create a scripted TTY login.

Supposedly MS has a scripting engine in beta, but we don't have a copy and it is not clear how we get one. Also, it is not clear if MS is going to include the scripting engine in the general Win 95 release or if it will be part of the Plus Pack. If it is not included in the general release, then it would be good if we could get rights to redistribute it.

3. Most recent version of Win 95 release candidate. Troy said that they are supposedly sending this to us express mail today. However, it would be good if we could be classified as some kind of fast track beta customer to make sure we get future updates right away.
