Everyone could still be a part of the referral server. thoughts on the idea on the remote chance they are interested?

realistically, they are a partner and a major content house. we have to try and figure out a way to include them and discuss it with them. it may be that we don't figure something out but we have to try. as i said before i will send you a doc with the general goals we have for all the top deals so you can give feedback.

I have never agreed to anything where AOL is equal to MSN - they are one level below in the deal where they agreed to support our browser.

>> specifically you said that there would be a ever so slight advantage for MSN. The example you gave was if the user had a dialog that let them select their channels then in the window MSN would be pre-selected, but the user could go choose others. we are operating with that spirit.

Anything new we give them we would have to see a major benefit from. I don't know why we would discuss Active Desktop with them unless we have something major we are asking them to do for us.

I think on the UI front and the technology front Netscape has taken the basic IE 4 idea and is executing on it far better than we are.
