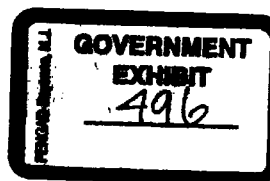
Here is latest browser share, using our 3 core methodologies along with trends for the past 6 months.

In general we see a sharp uptick in share from Sep to December due to the ie4 launch. All 3 methodologies show us gaining about 5% in share for this time period. Starting January there is a leveling off.

For those of you concerned with the calldown share drop from Jan-Feb drop to 38%; this is mainly due to a drop in AOL; not IE. The IE portion is relatively constant. I will monitor this and see if this AOL drop was an aberration or if more AOL people say they use the IE browser; or something else.
