There are three things an OEM wants to provide  
One button sign up (like MSN today)  
Configuration of the system to their service  
Branding of the browser (like internetMCI)  
Internet mail and other standard services (probably news falls into this category)

Solution on both Win3 1 and Win95, possibly Mac (??)

Recommendations, in priority order -- pls send comments/questions

- 1) Deliver an OEM "kit" for IExplore This kit should include
  - Brandable browser
  - Exchange Internet mail provider
  - Configuration DLL that sets up your system
  - Setup program that allows for "plug in" sign up programs -- OEM's can crop their own sign up in and we will exec it
  - Sample "sign up" program (with source code) that allows sign up over the phone -- an OEM can have customers call a 1-800 number, get the account with an operator over the phone, and then have that operator walk through filling in the relevant information

Work Items (should be done in 1 1 timeframe)

Factor out the configuration DLL from the Internet Setup Wizard -- make a configuration tool that takes a set of parameters and configures TCP/IP-RNA-RAS based on those Est 2-4 wks

Provide "branding" of the browser -- need to define what this is, but I would assume it means customizing the splash screen, and giving up real estate for a bitmap/icon on the toolbar 1 wk

Provide a simple "stub" program that let's the user fill in information about their account, then calls the configuration DLL Est ???

- 2) Make our browser functionally equivalent to NetScape, post beta of this by 8/24 (Win95 launch) Already planned for version 1 1, but this means tables, SSL, and news

Work items (also 1 1 timeframe)

SSL Already checked in being tested now

Tables Biggest work item, estimate to come

News Meeting with SukvG (Exchange team) this week to check status of their provider Otherwise we may have to recommend public domain news servers, or we could enable the news reader in our spyglass code (ouch)

- 3) Figure out pricing and promote aggressively

We need someone who will go and sell this thing -- we have no owner for this JohnLu, ideas?

- 4) Find partners to fill in the holes

There are two holes we need to fill in, but it is in our best interests to find partners to do this work They are Win3.1 solution, and sign up for the Win95 solution

Work items

Company willing to do custom setup/sign up work for hire Ideas here are NetManage and possible Shiva

Company willing to license a complete solution on Win3 1 Again, maybe NetManage, possible Shiva, don't know who else.

Owner I would prefer not to drive this, but don't have any bright ideas about who else should do it Maybe ArthurB??
