A gustnado along the leading edge of a bow echo, moved along Highway 14 through the town. Damage was spotty and mostly to weak structures, trees and power lines. Mobile homes were blown off their foundations and several homes sustained roof damage, ranging from a few shingles being removed to entire sections of the roof being removed. Several homes also sustained siding and antenna damage. Numerous sheds and outbuildings were damage and destroyed. One small shed was picked up and carried for over 100 yardsover a row of trees into a nearby yard. A seed cleaning company was also destroyed, as half of the metal and tin building was blown and twisted by the wind. a church also sustained roof damage. Many large trees were blown down, snapped off or uprooted, and street and yards were littered with large limbs, tin and other debris from the storm. There were no injuries. The entire town of Payneway was without power the next day. The storm continued east, damaging trees and weak structures at Tyronza and Marked Tree.
