# A. Wildlife Species Common to Most FMUs in the Taos Field Office

## 1. Game Animals:

Muledeer, Elk, Antelope, Mountain Lion, Black Bear, Turkey

#### 2. Other species:

Bobcat, Coyote, Gray Fox, Porcupine, Jackrabbit, Kangaroo Rat, Deer Mouse, Least Chipmunk, Prairie Dog, Squirrel, Chipmunk, Badger, Raccoon, Ringtail, Muskrat, Mink, various Bat species, Bobcat, Gray Fox, and Ringtail distribution would be intermittent in wooded and brushy areas. The Coyote is the most common mammal found throughout the area. Mountain Lion and Black Bear occur in limited numbers in mountainous areas.

#### 3. Upland Game Birds:

These could include the Mourning Dove and Scaled Quail.

#### 4. Raptors:

Raptors occurring in the Taos Field Office area include Sharp-shinned Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, Copper's Hawk, Swainson Hawk, Ferruginous Hawk, Golden Eagle, Bald Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Prairie Falcon, American Kestrel, Barn Owl, Screech Owl, Western Burrowing Owl, Mexican Spotted Owl and Great-Horned Owl.

# 5. Amphibians and Reptiles:

These include the Western Spadefoot toad, Leopard Frog, Collared Lizard, Great Plains Skink, Bull Snake, Western Diamondback Rattlesnake and Prairie Rattlesnake.
