



P.A.D. raises your risk of heart attack and stroke.

P.A.D. (peripheral arterial disease) means clogged arteries in your legs.

It raises your risk of heart attack, stroke, and even death. If you are age 50 or older, especially if you are African American; if you smoke or have smoked; have diabetes, high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol; or a personal or family history of vascular disease, heart attack, or stroke, your chances of getting P.A.D. are higher. Talk to your health care provider and take steps to learn about P.A.D.
