Summary: Fire Island National Seashore has 17 preexisting communities within its boundary. These communities, accessible by boat or ferry, see more than two million visitors each summer, although many are unaware that they are in a national seashore. Each community has its own history and compelling stories. This project will share these stories and links to the park.

A three- sided NPS wayside exhibit, installed in each community center, will depict general park orientation; natural, cultural and recreational resources the park offers; and will tell the unique story of the community. The process will foster a better working relationship with the communities to further goals of park protection and recreational opportunities. The measurable results will be increased visitor understanding and support for park purpose and mission.
