Hurricane Katrina will require a massive volunteer response, perhaps the largest in our nation's history. There will be a need for volunteers in the affected states as well as the cities where evacuees are being relocated. There will be short term and long-term volunteer needs in sheltering, mass care, and victim assistance and rebuilding needs.

To assist you in reaching potential AmeriCorps applicants with a specific interest in serving in Hurricane Katrina related opportunities, we have modified the online AmeriCorps Recruitment and Placement System to include **Hurricane Katrina** to the list of Service Area selections. If your AmeriCorps members will address issues related to Hurricane Katrina during their term of service, we encourage you to take the following steps:

- Enter a separate program listing or adjust your current listing on the recruitment website, selecting **Hurricane Katrina** as your Service Area.
- Include specific Hurricane Katrina related activities in your two-line program description.
- Consider using Hurricane Katrina as one of your key words so that potential applicants may find your program with a keyword search.
